


# Only 33% of Hispanics Believe U.S. is Headed in the Right Direction

#### **US Right or Wrong Track**











How certain are you that this is the right choice of candidate for you?







If the election for the United States House of Representatives were held today, which party's candidate would you vote for?




# **Hispanics More Likely than Non-Hispanics to Be Crossover Voters This Election**













- 42% OF HISPANICS SAY ENDORSEMENT WILL NOT HAVE AN IMPACT ON VOTING DECISION







Do you think that you know enough now about the candidates and their positions on the issues most important to you to confidently make a voting decision?




### 50% of Hispanics Don't Have All the Party Information They Need to Make Voting Decision






How do you plan to vote in the General election?




