


## Only 25% of Hispanics Believe U.S. is Headed in the Right Direction

#### **US Right or Wrong Track**




















If the election for the United States House of Representatives were held today, which party's candidate would you vote for?








## Willingness to Vote for Candidates in General Election
















Do you watch or stream Spanish-language news?


### 56% of Hispanics Need More Information About the Candidates & Their Positions on the Issues

Do you think that you know enough now about the candidates and their positions on the issues most important to you to confidently make a voting decision?




### 55% of Hispanics Don't Have All the Party Information They Need to Make Voting Decision





#### - HISPANICS MORE LIKELY THAN NON-HISPANICS TO VOTE EARLY AND IN PERSON


How do you plan to vote in the General election?

#### Vota Conmigo Familiarity




