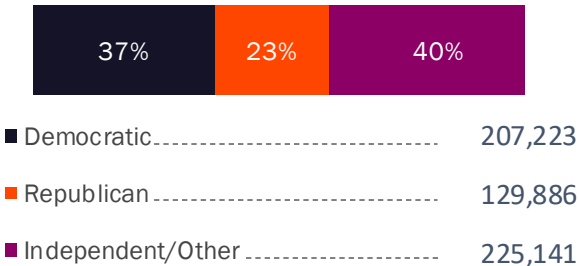

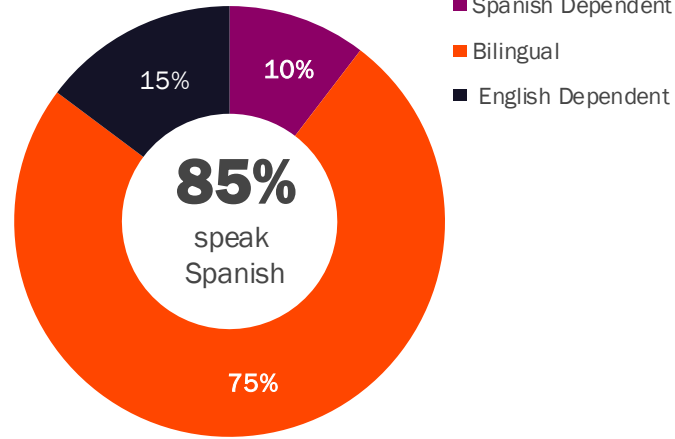

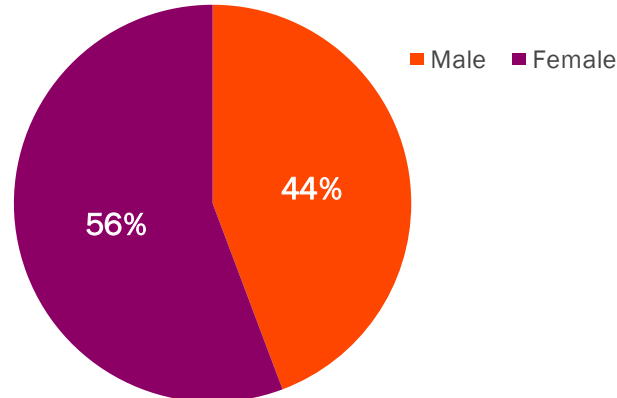

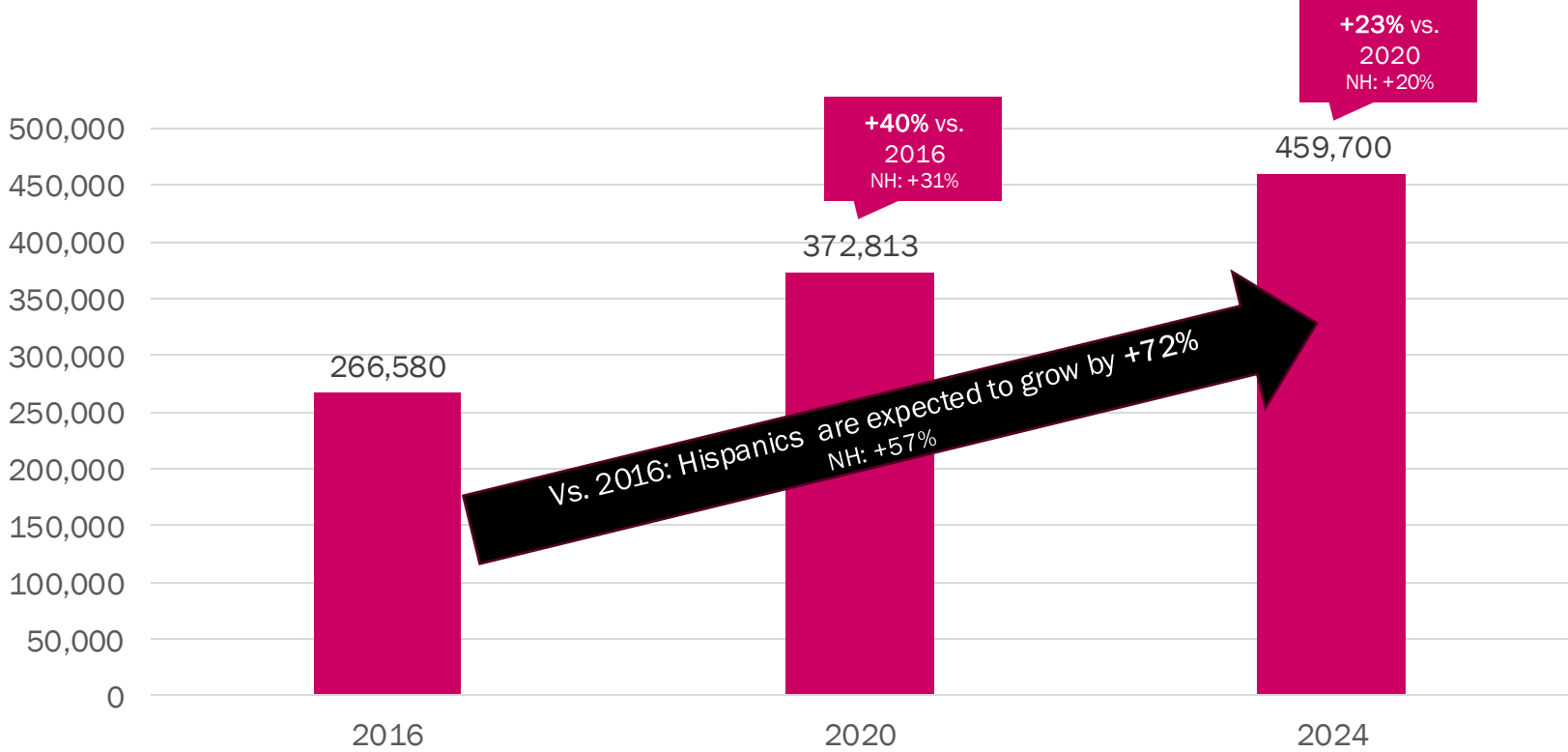

# Methodology

- Online survey of 544 likely voters ages 18+

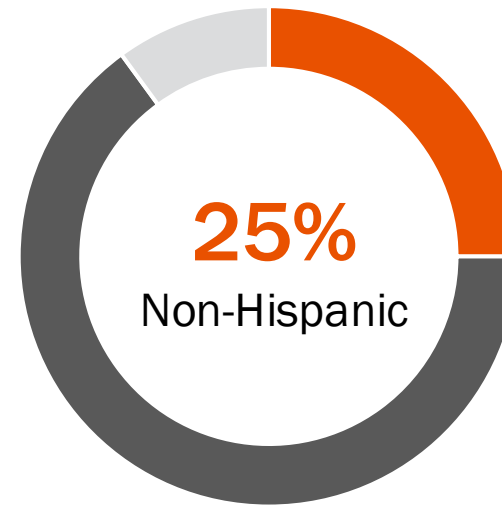
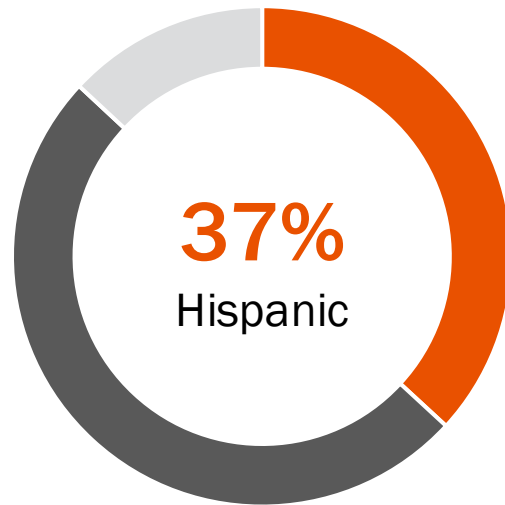
<p><u>A18+</u></p> <p>266 Hispanic (209 SpanDom/Bilingual)</p> <p>278 Non-Hispanic</p>
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- In field 8/1/2024 – 8/8/2024
- Weighted to the registered voter universe by age, gender, education, and political party affiliation. Results from full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 6.1% for Hispanics and 6.0% for Non-Hispanics.

*In general, do you believe that the United States is headed in the right direction, or has it gone off on the wrong track?*

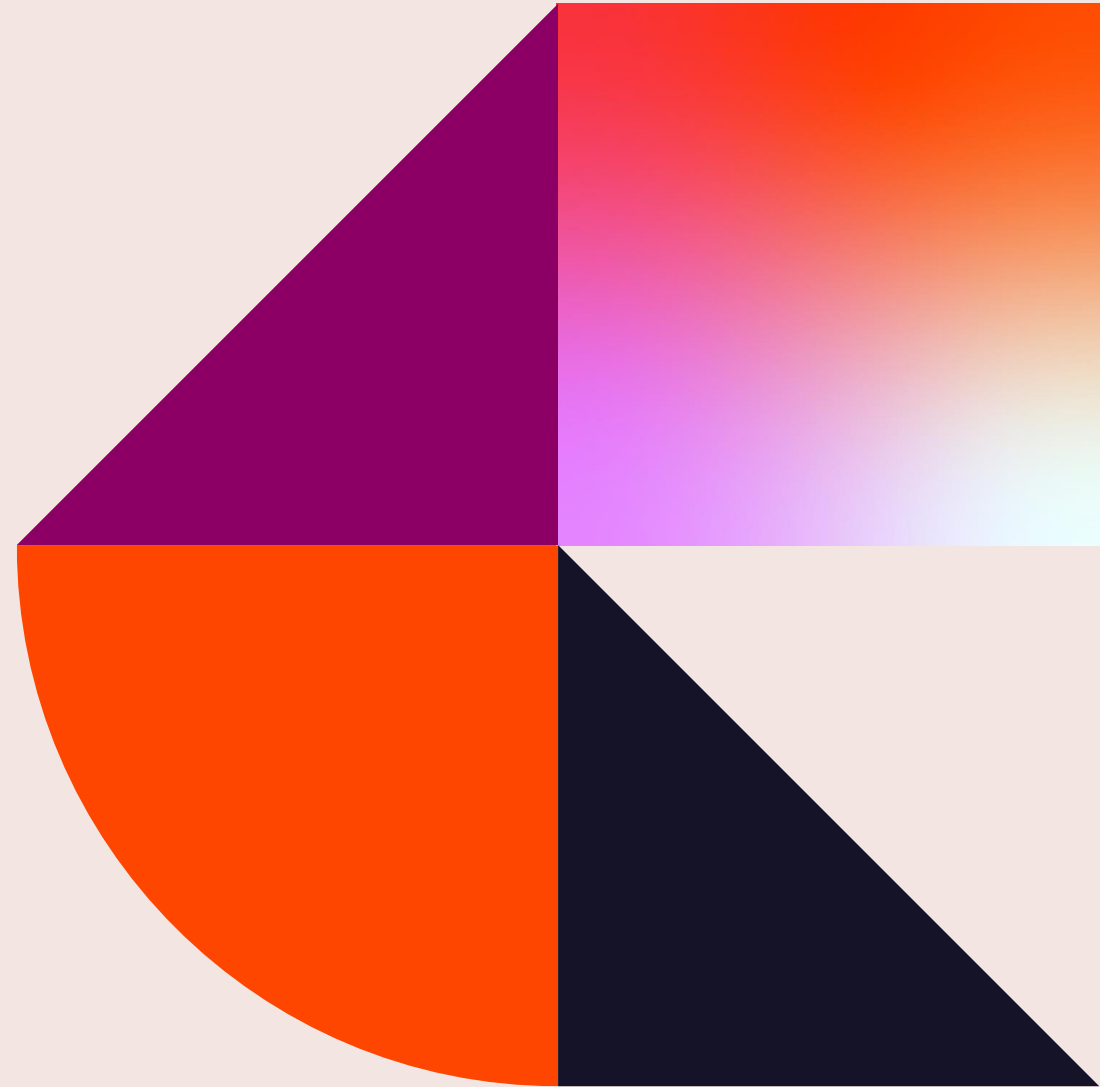
US Right or Wrong Track

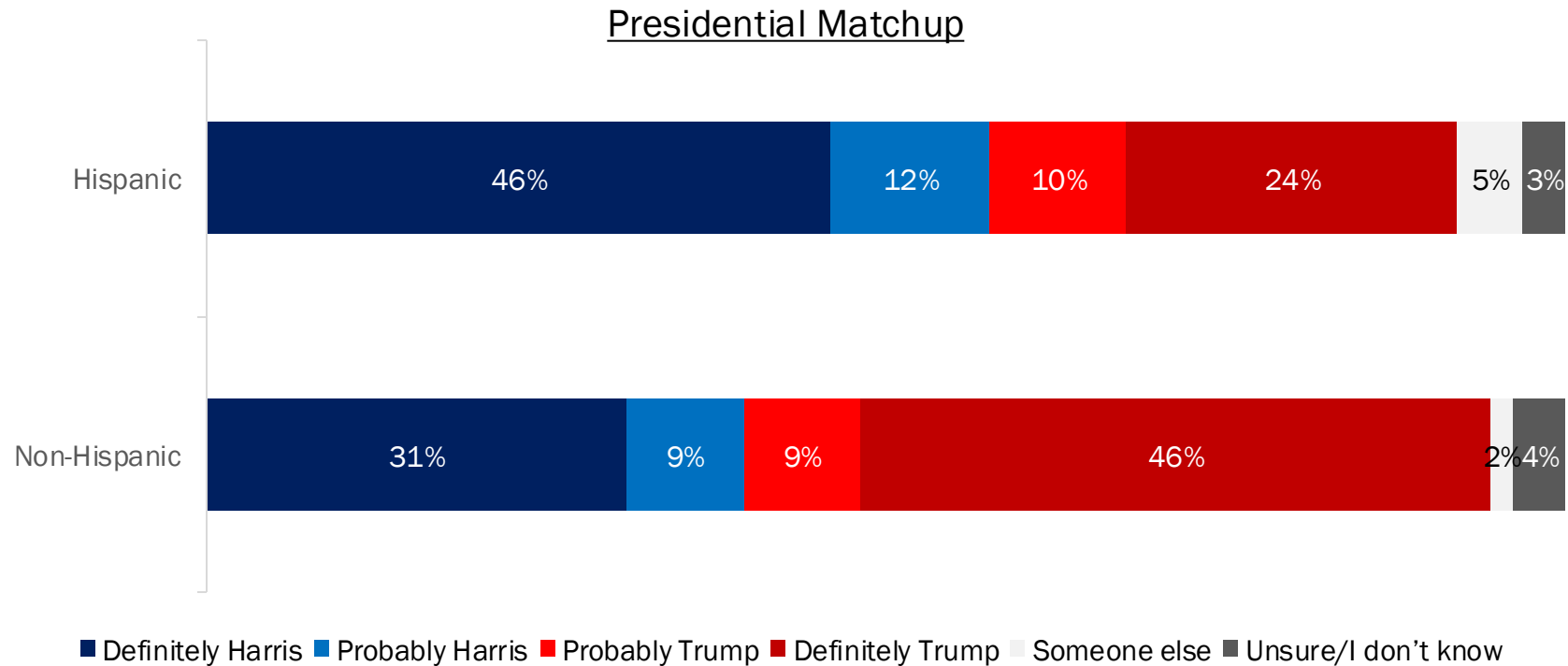

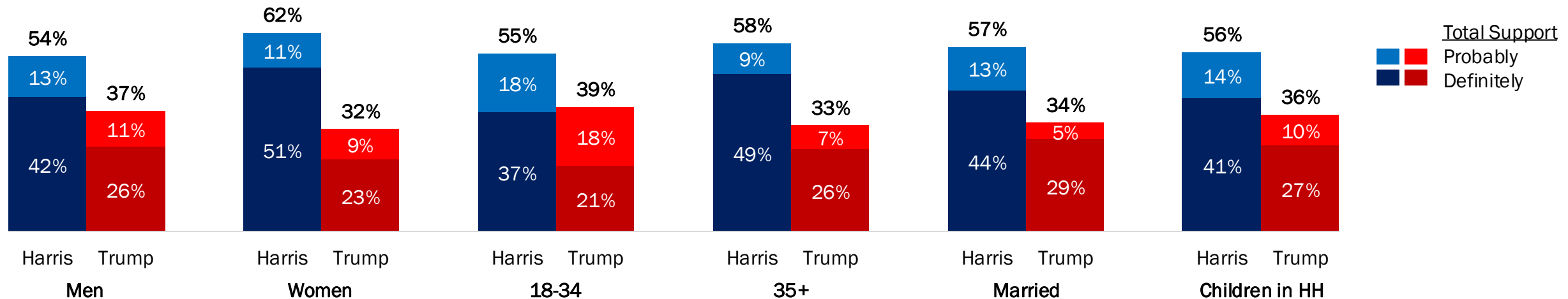

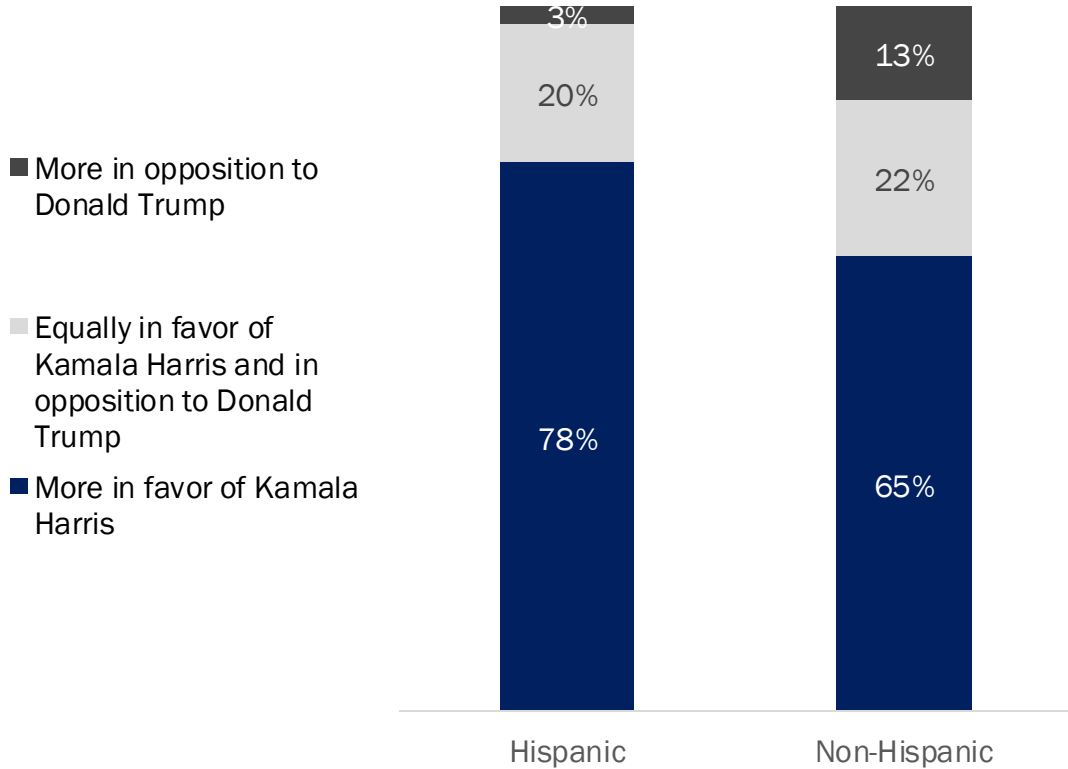

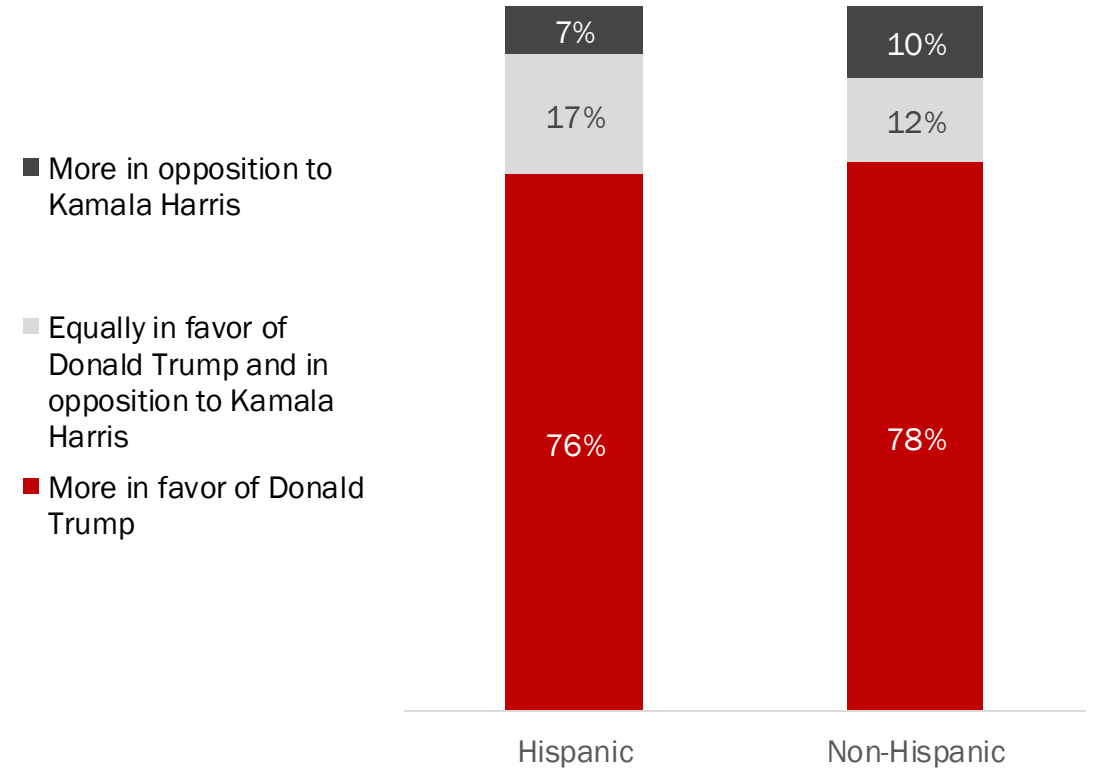

Voting Trump: Favor Trump or Oppose Harris

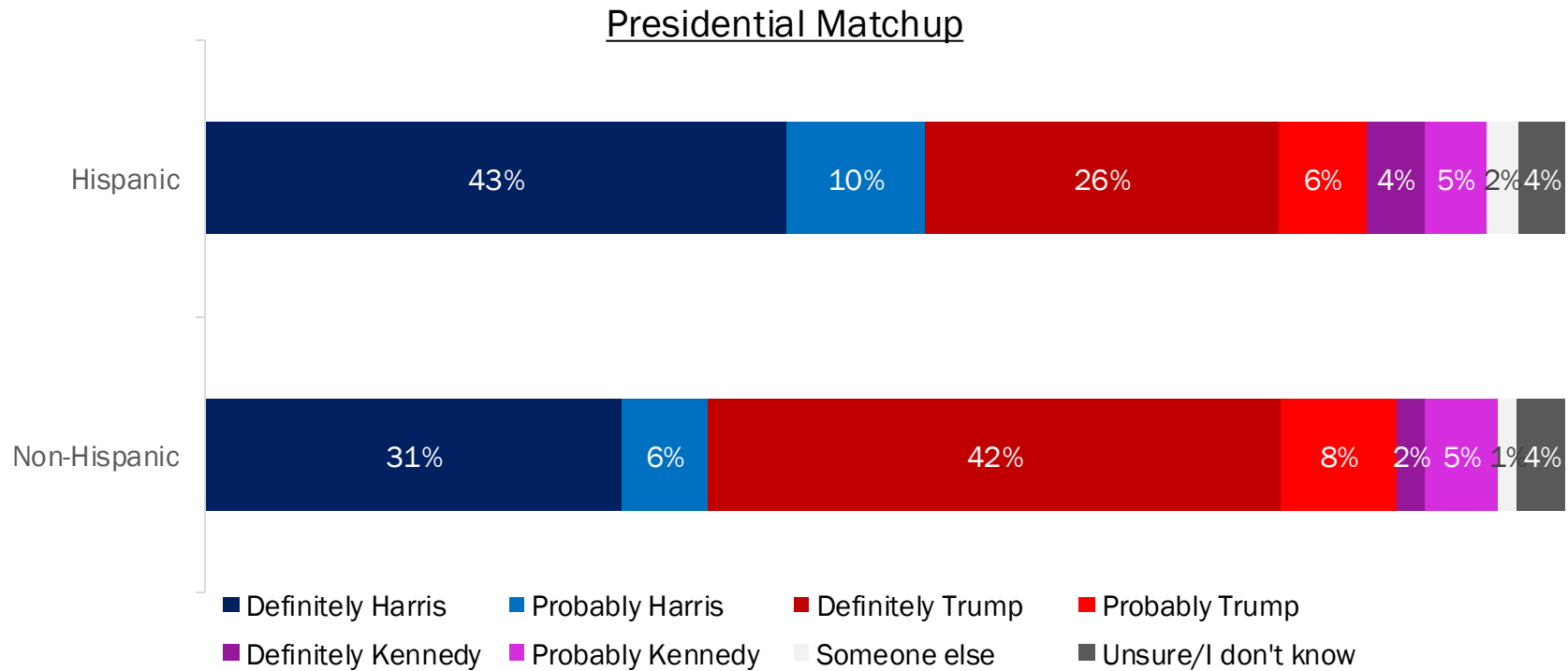

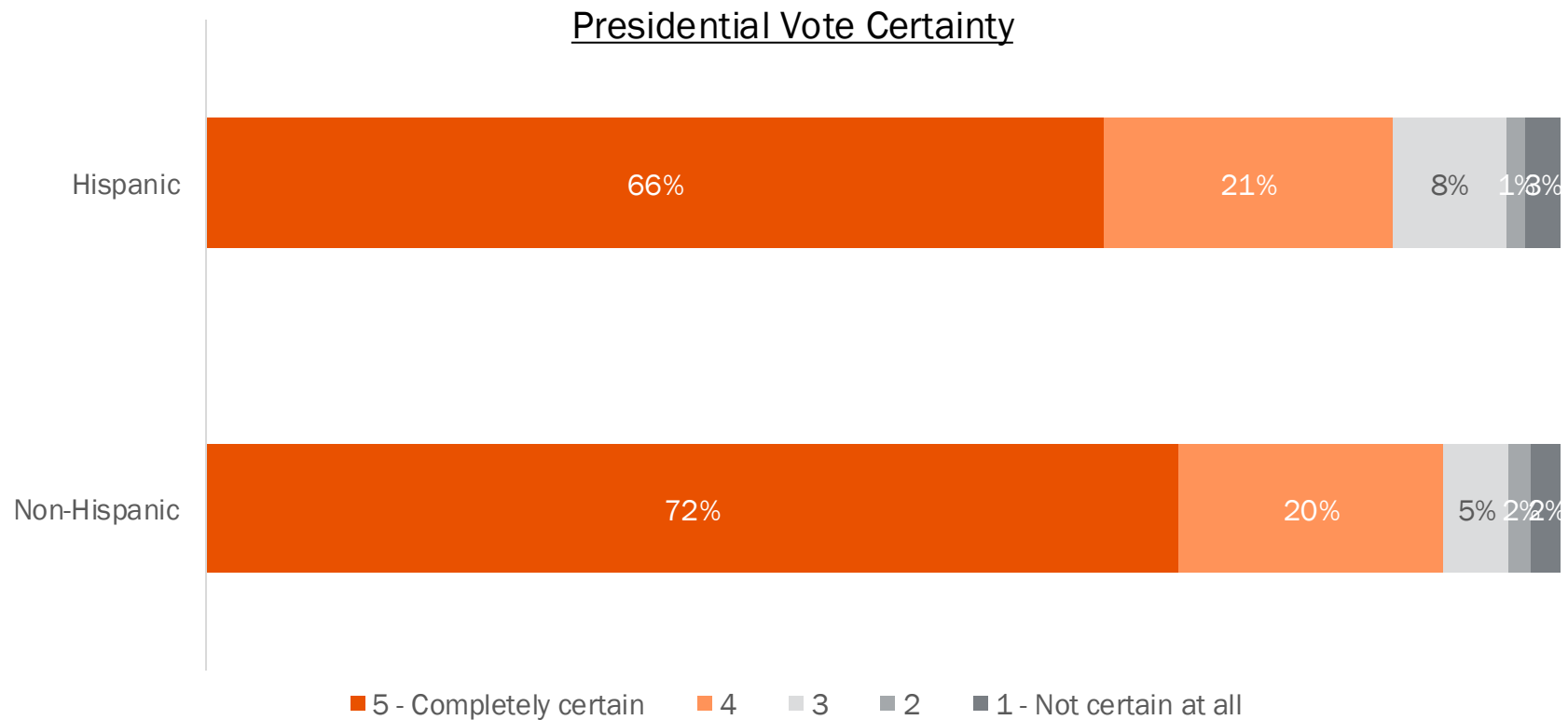

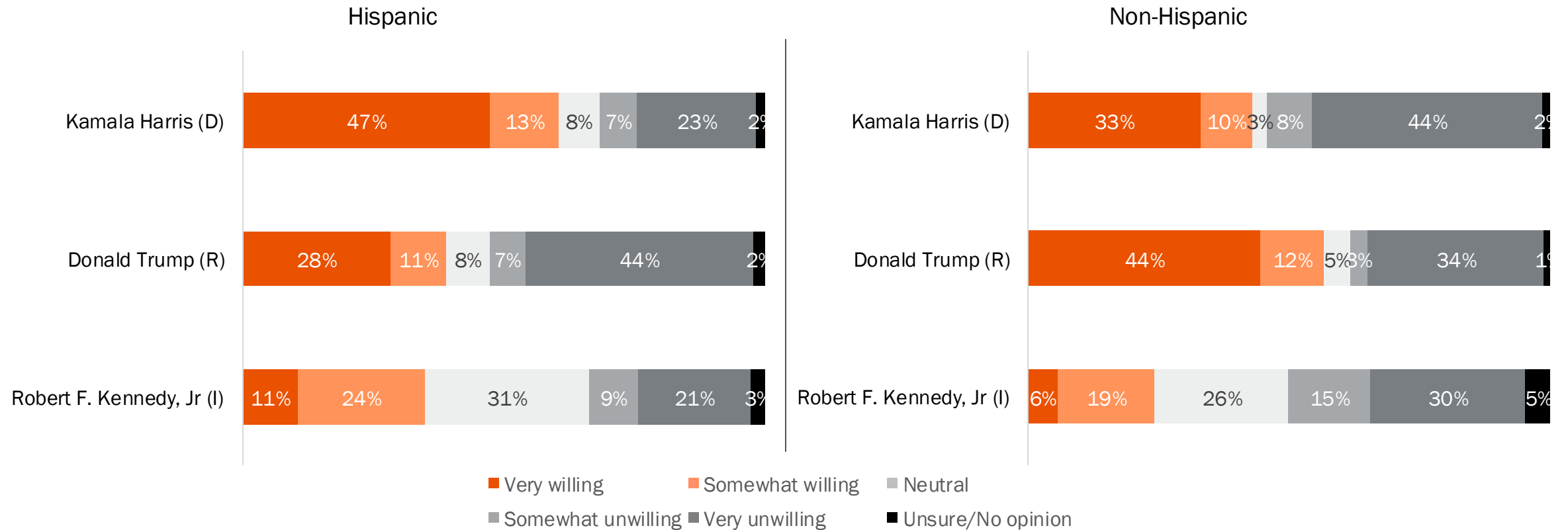
How certain are you that this is the right choice of candidate for you?

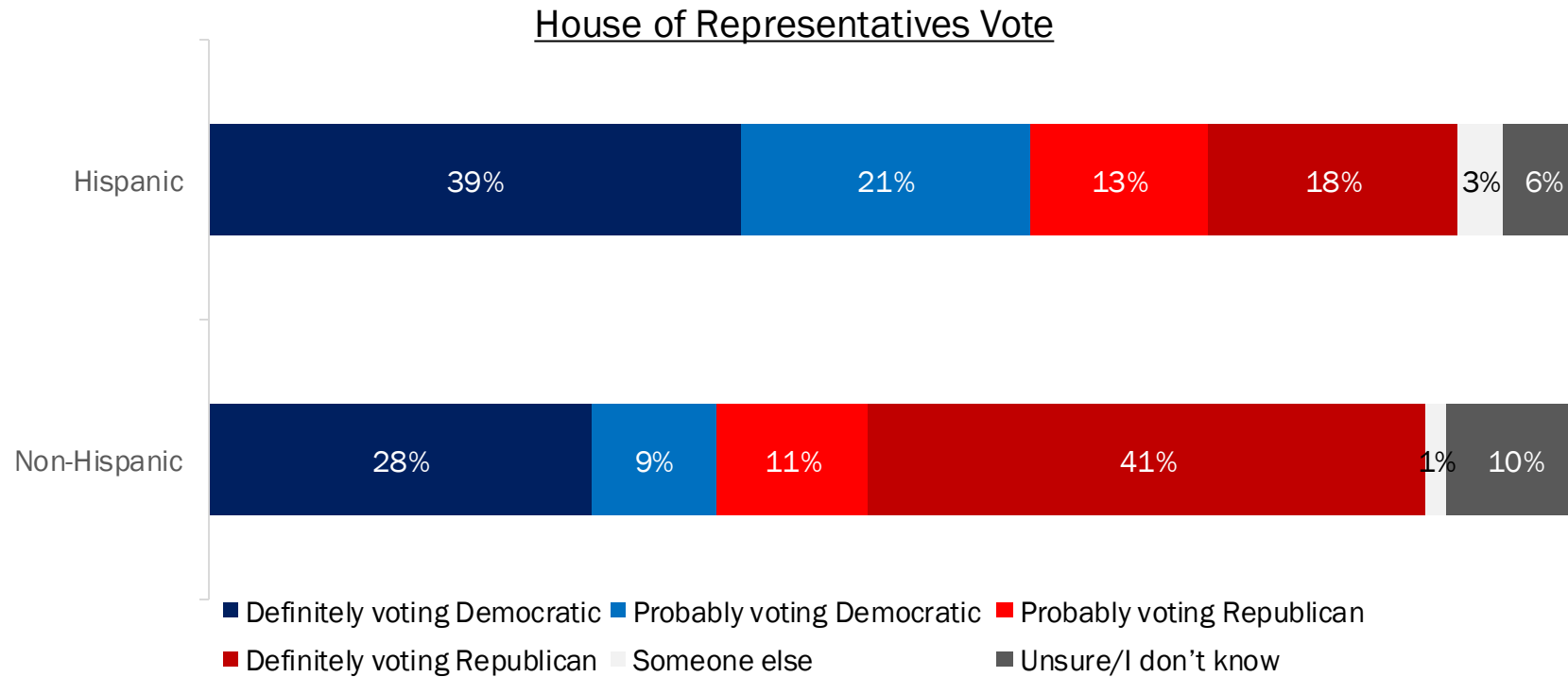

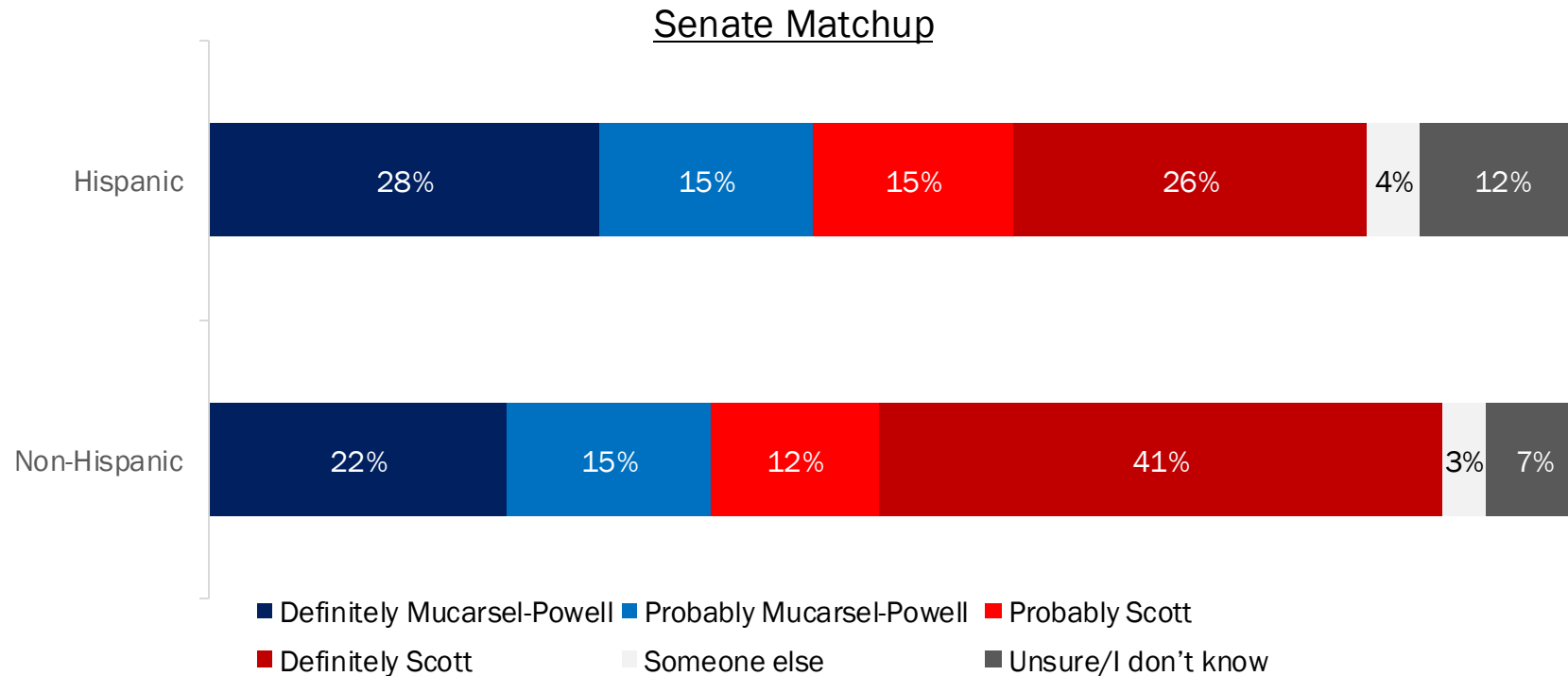
If the election for the United States House of Representatives were held today, which party's candidate would you vote for?

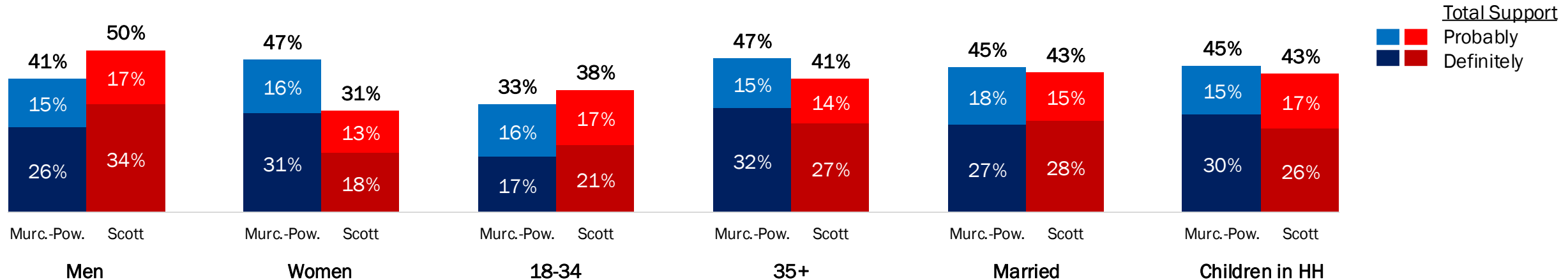

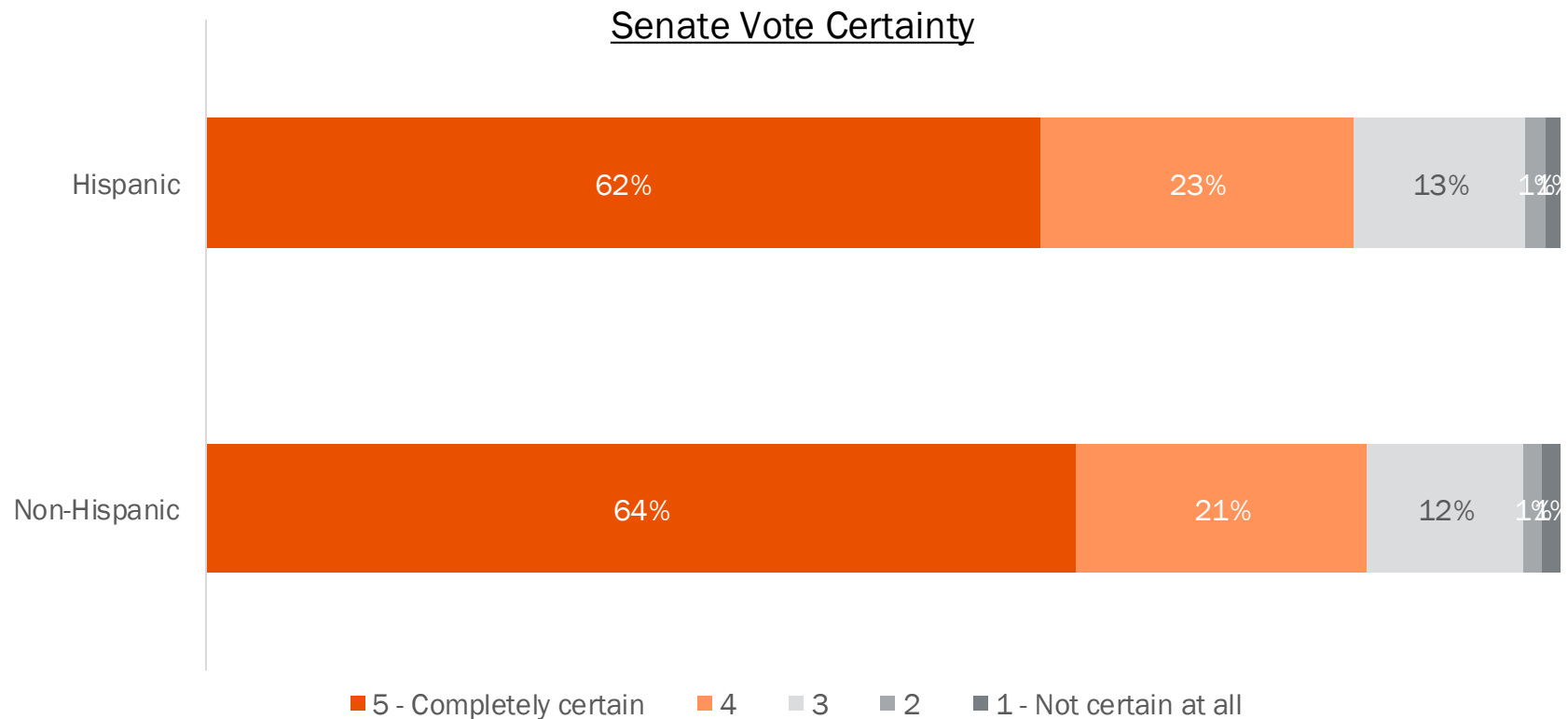

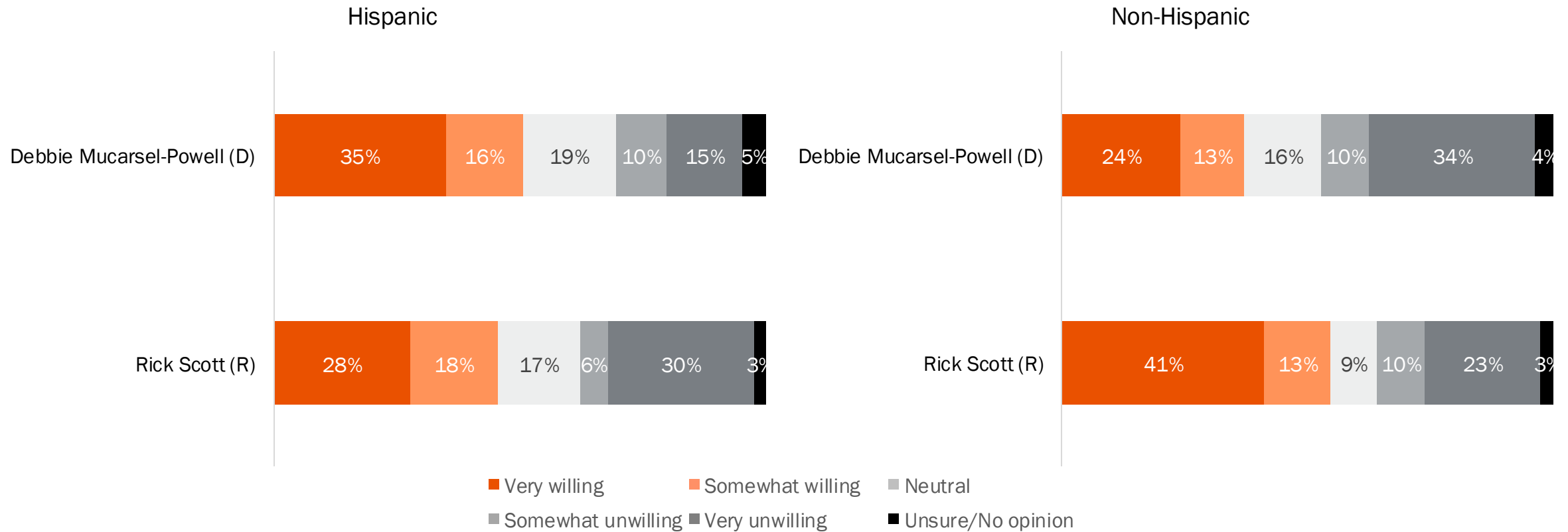
How certain are you that this is the right choice of candidate for you?

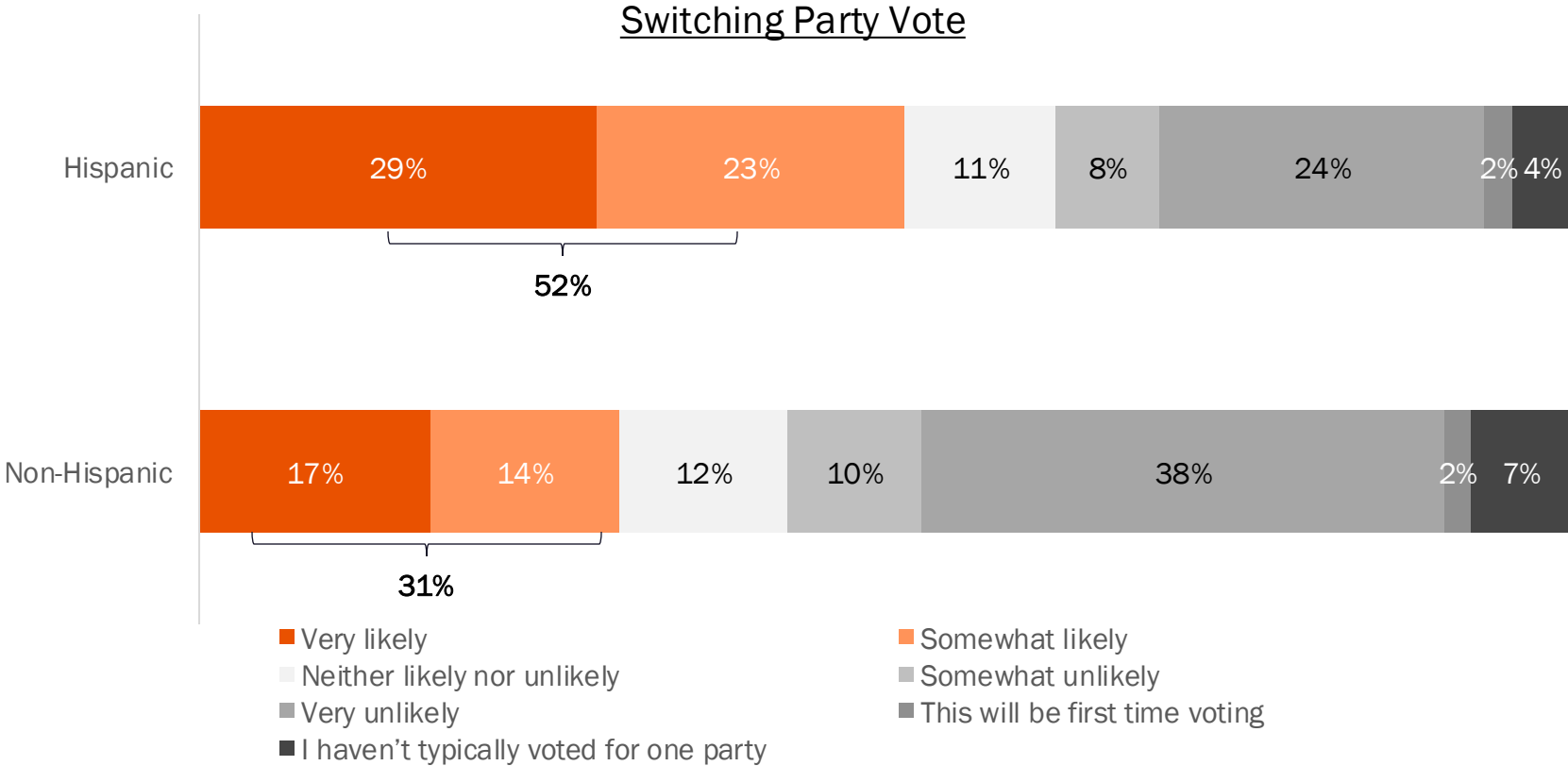

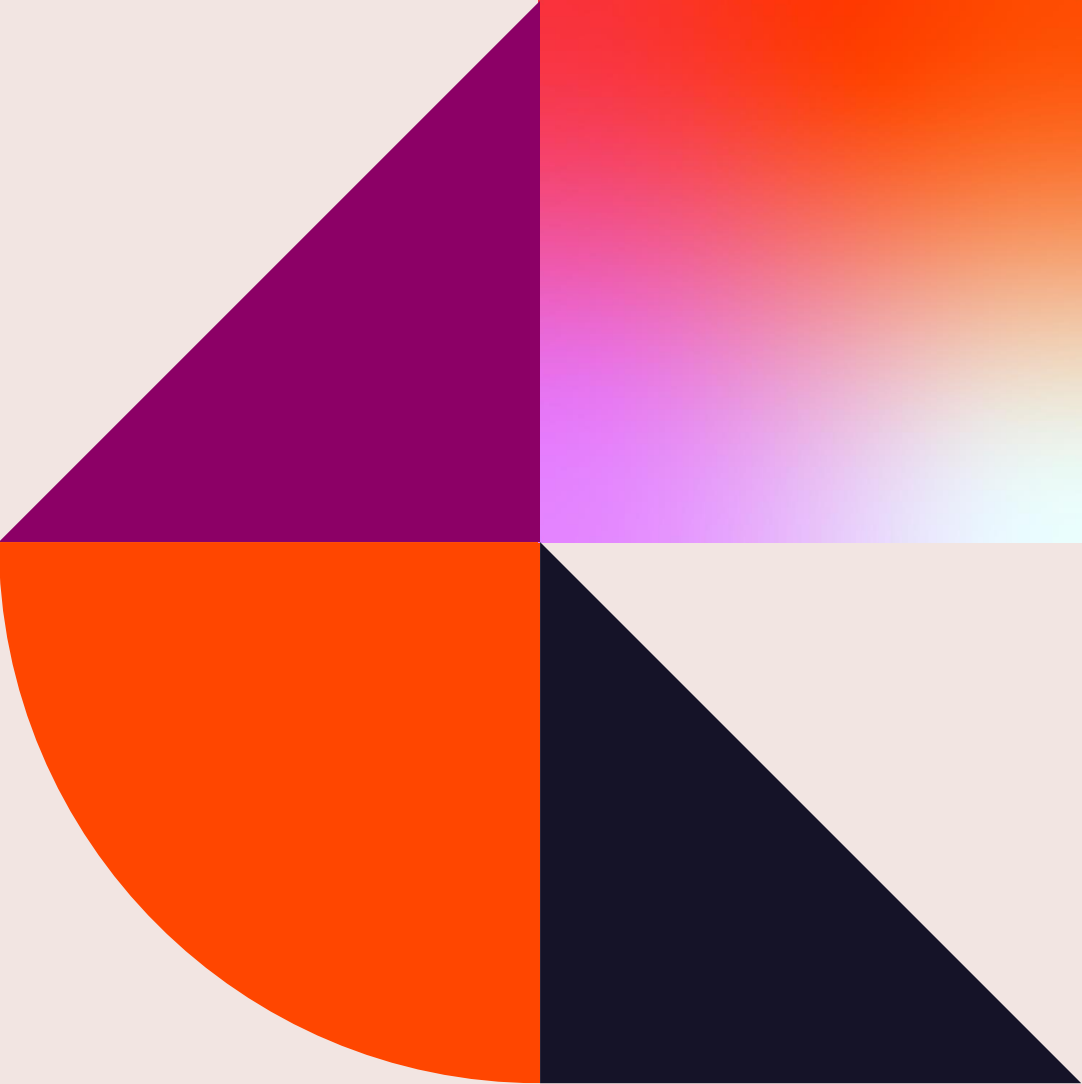
In the upcoming general election in November, how likely or unlikely are you to vote for a candidate from a political party that you typically have not voted for in the past?

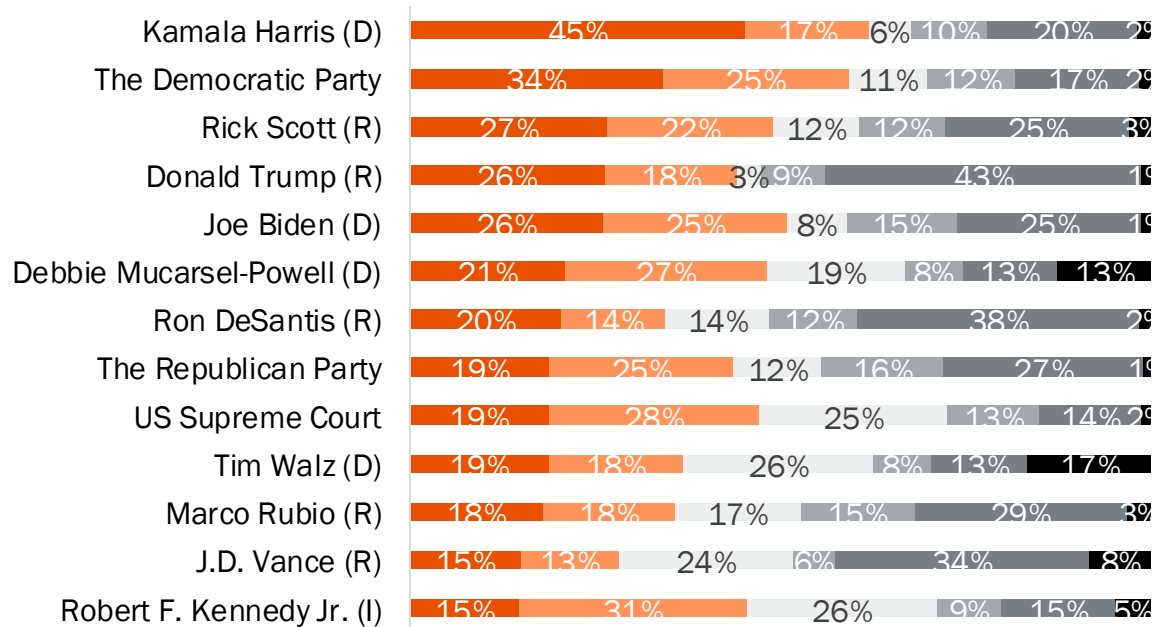

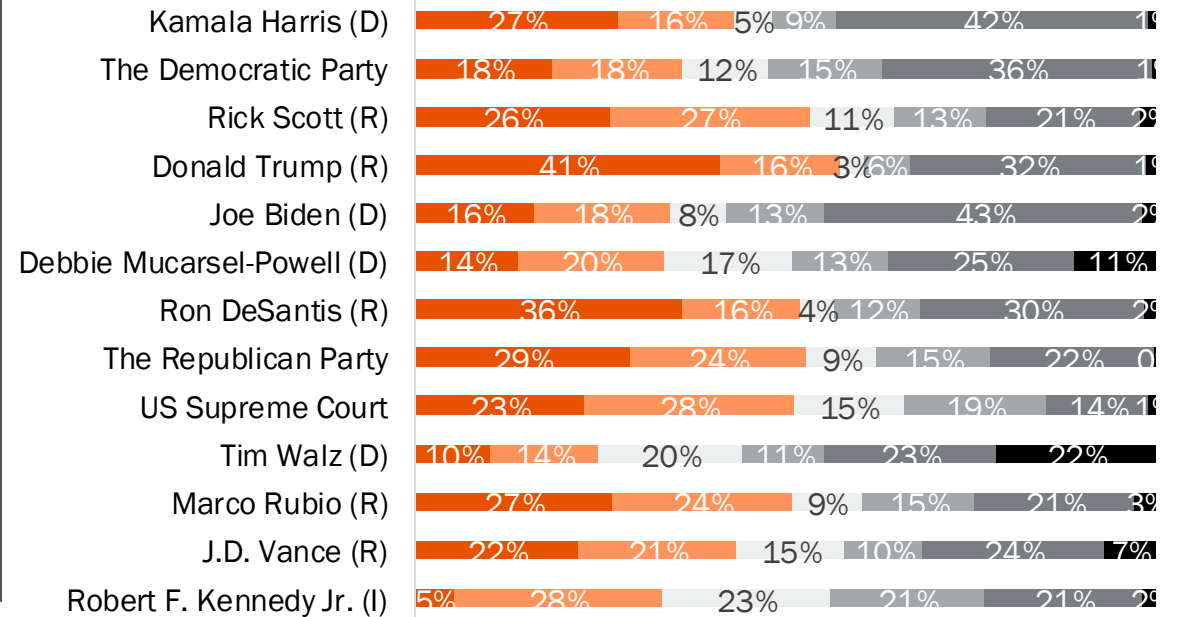

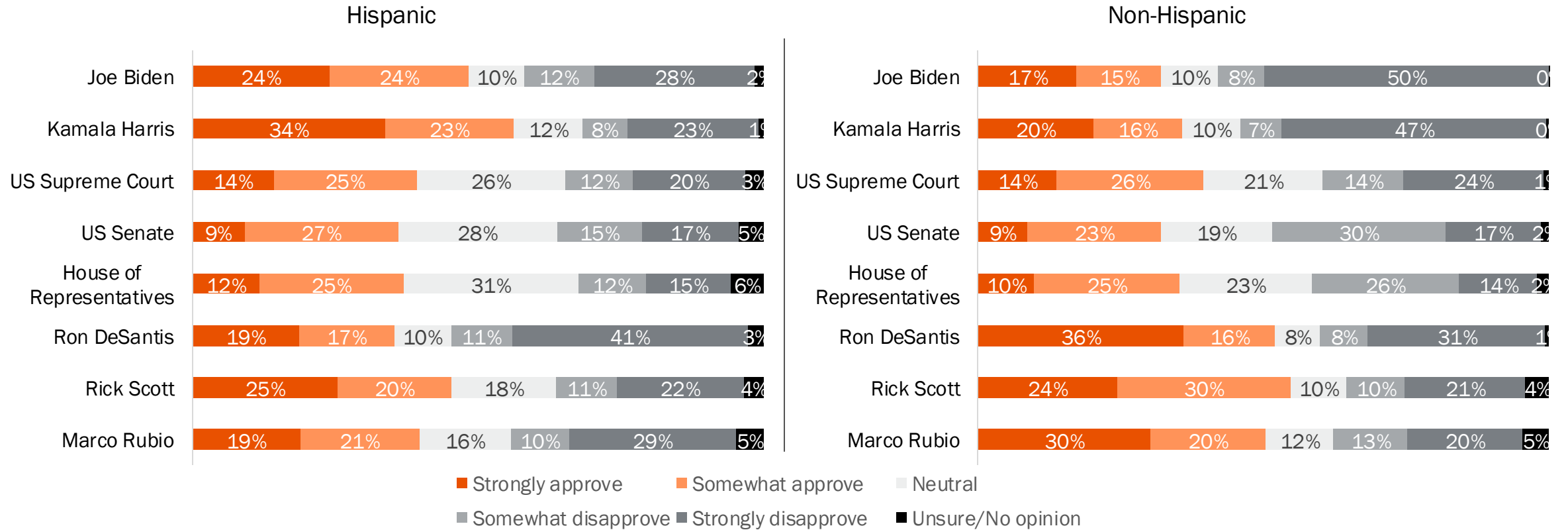

Do you approve or disapprove of the way [x] is handling their job?

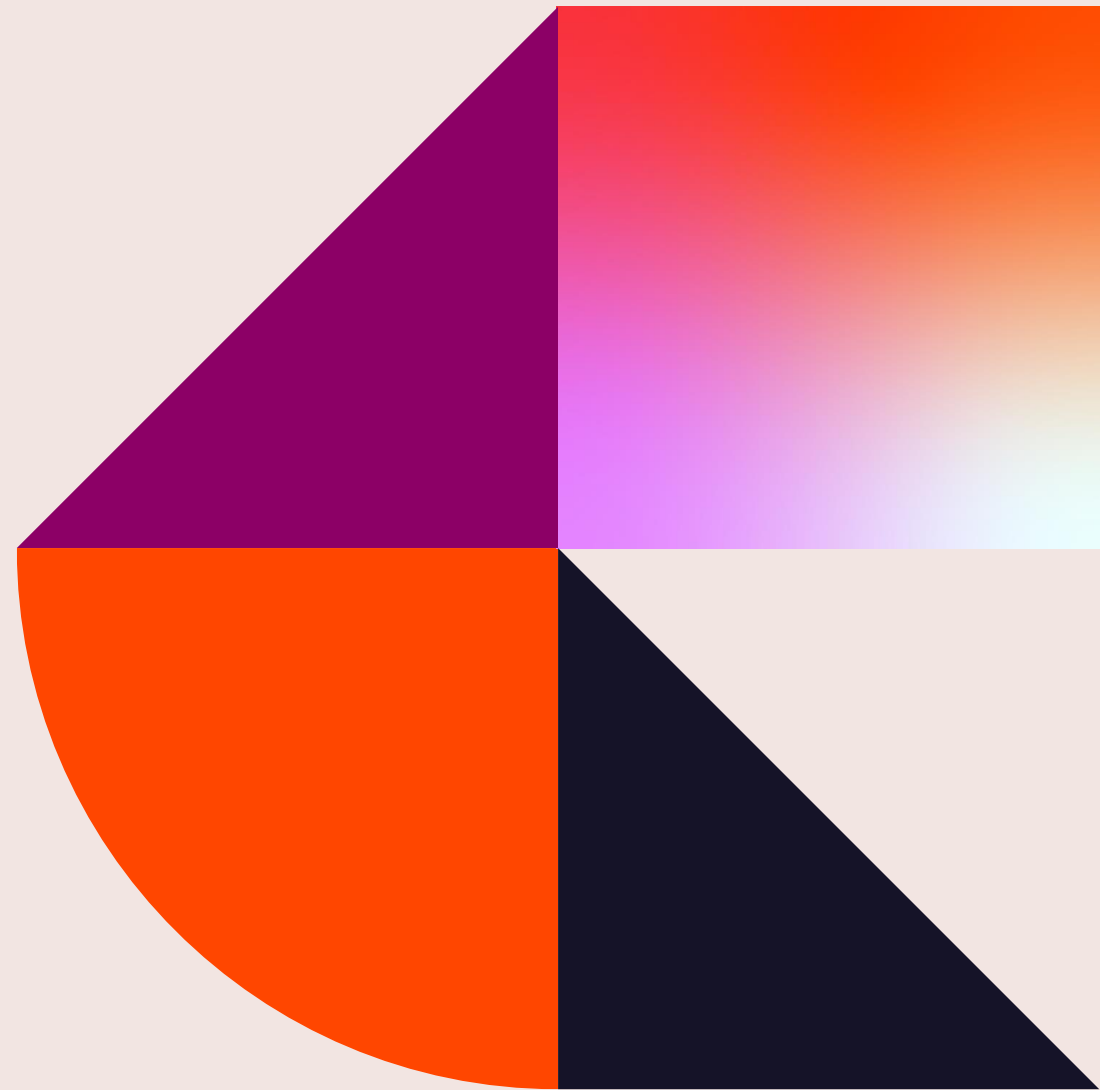

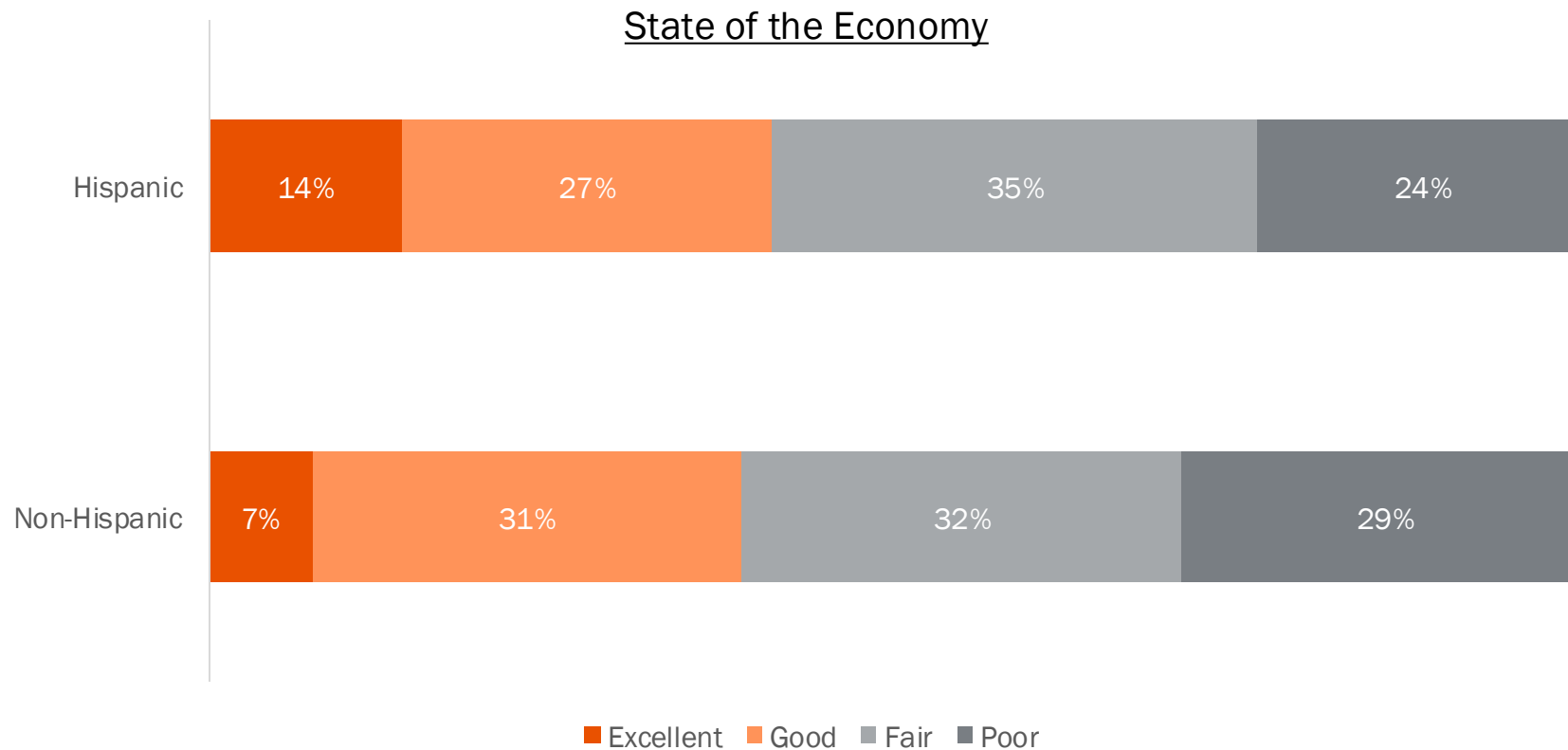

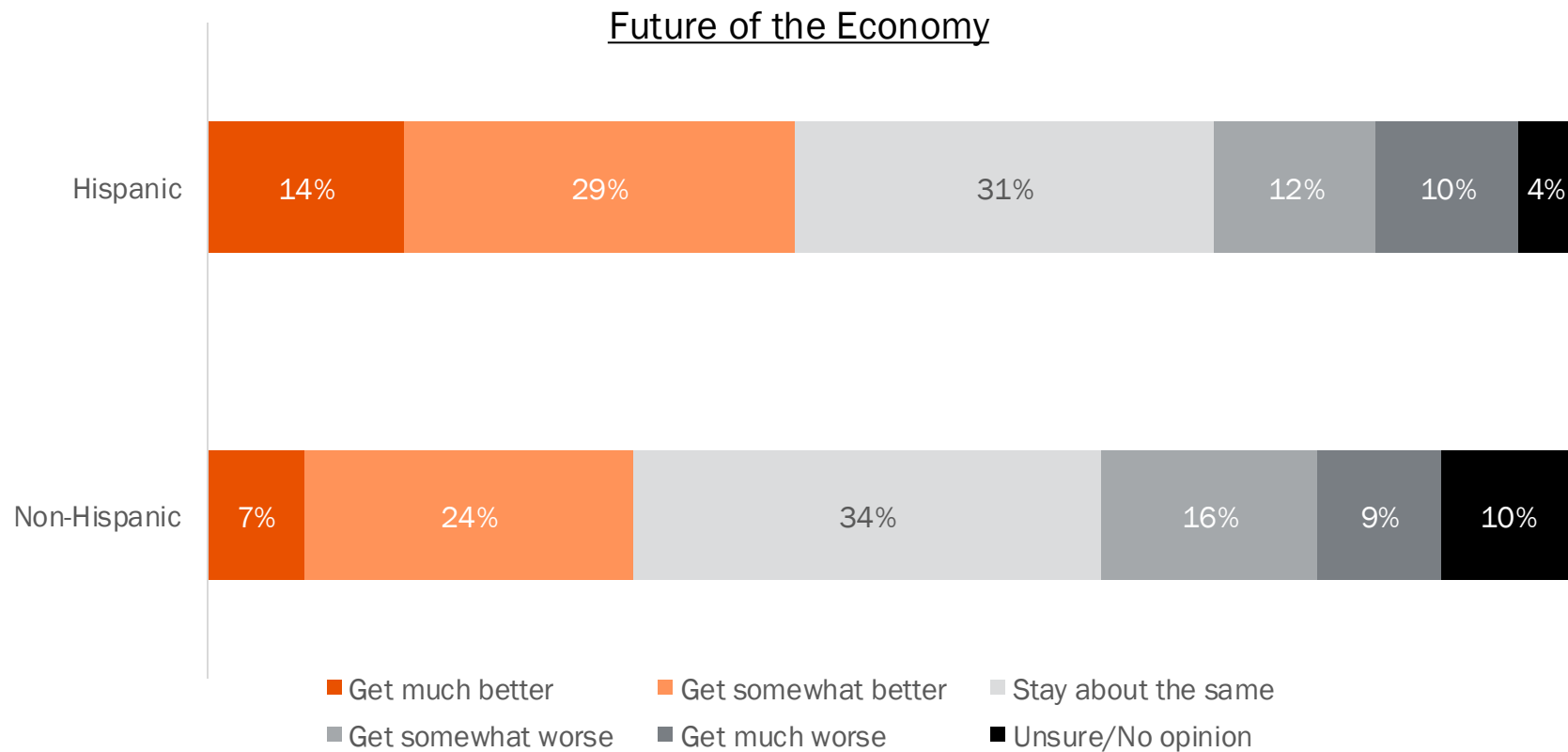

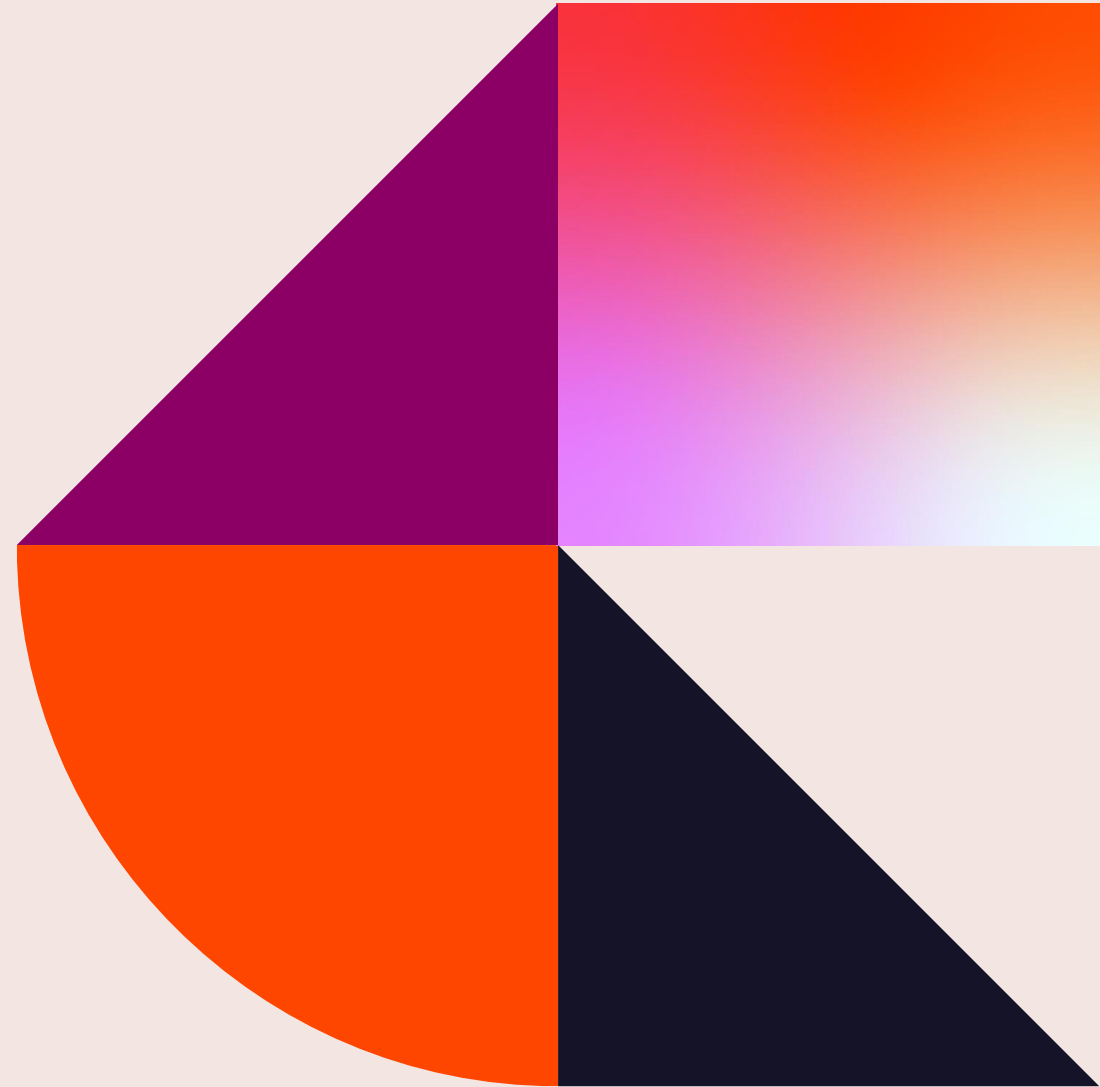

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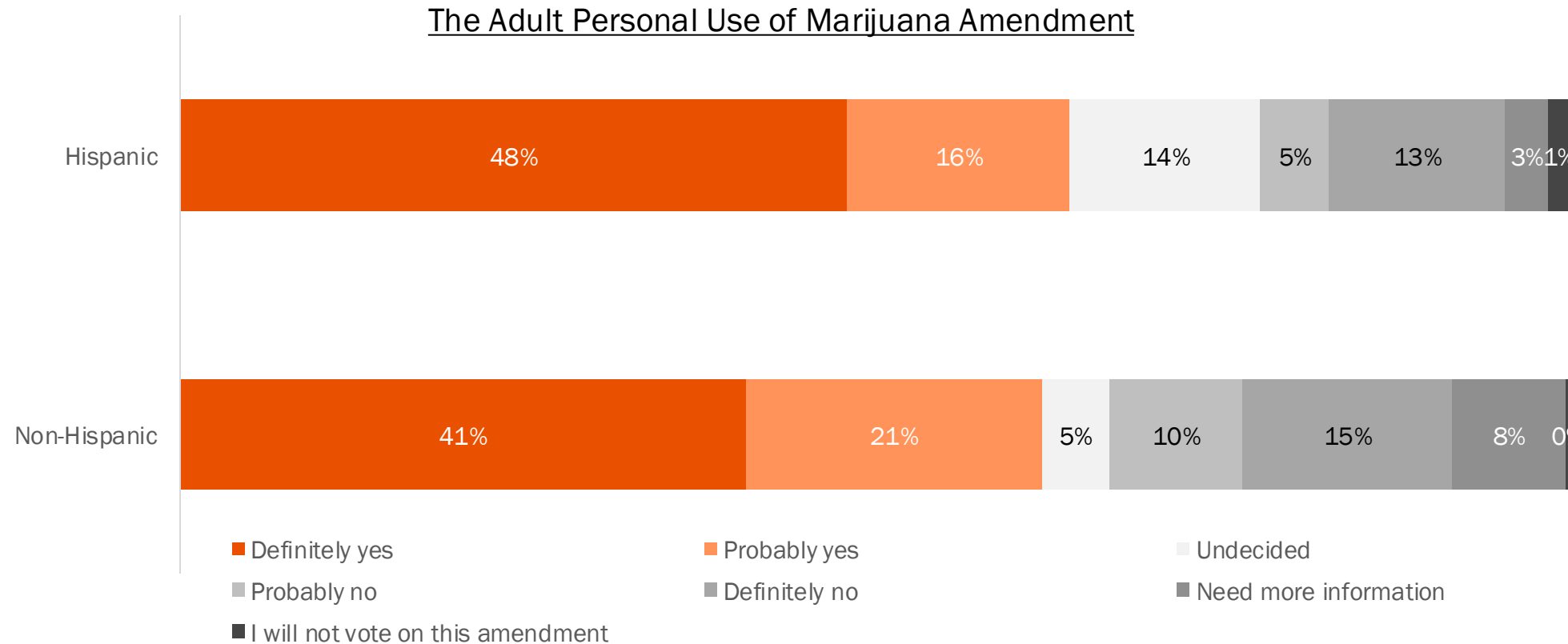

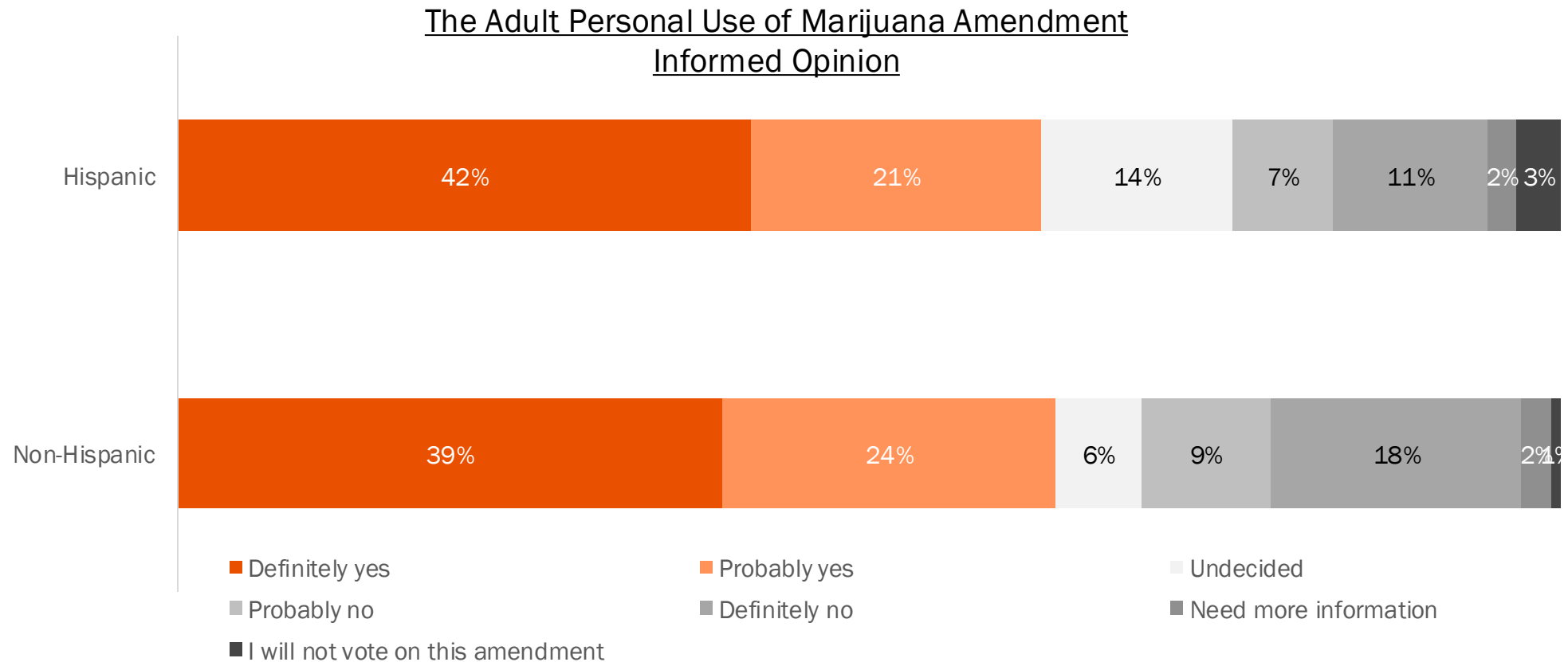


# The Adult Personal Use of Marijuana Amendment Informed Opinion

Again, if the election were held today, would you vote yes or no on this amendment?

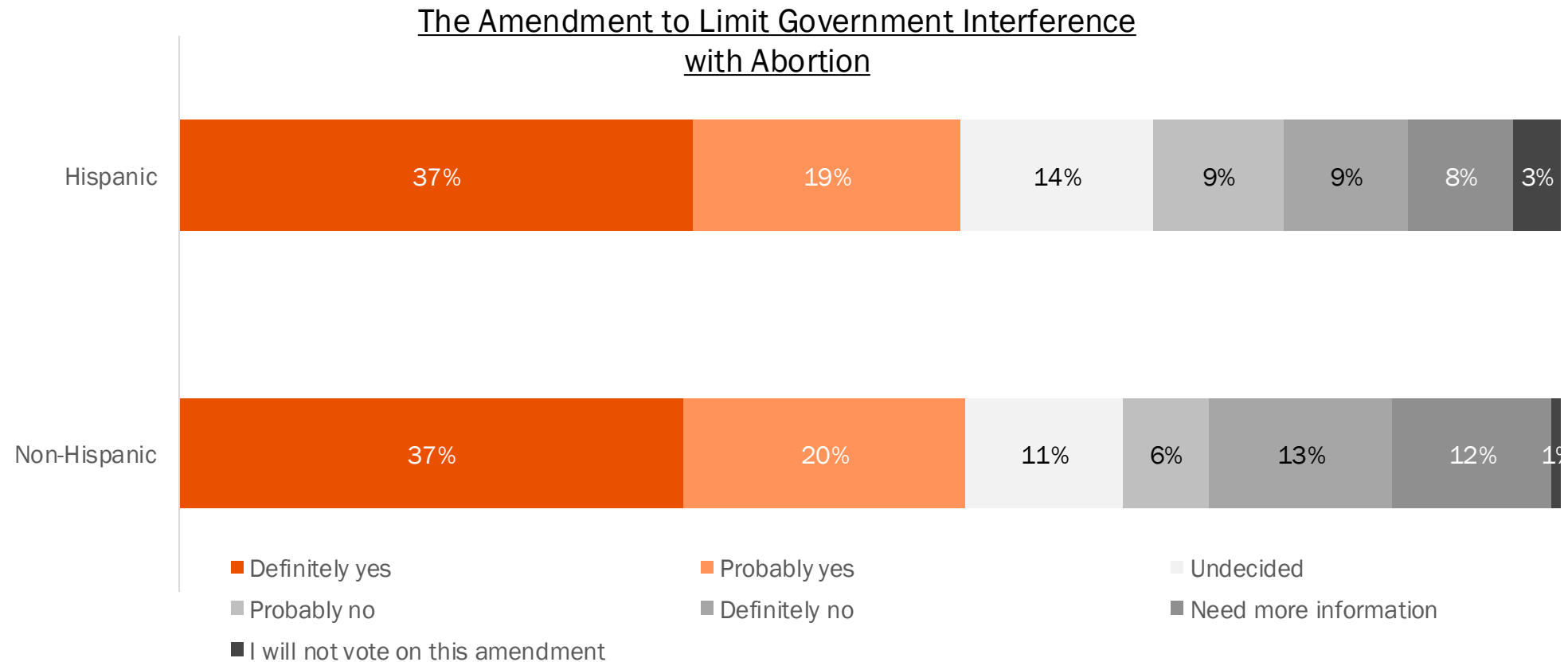


# The Amendment to Limit Government Interference with Abortion

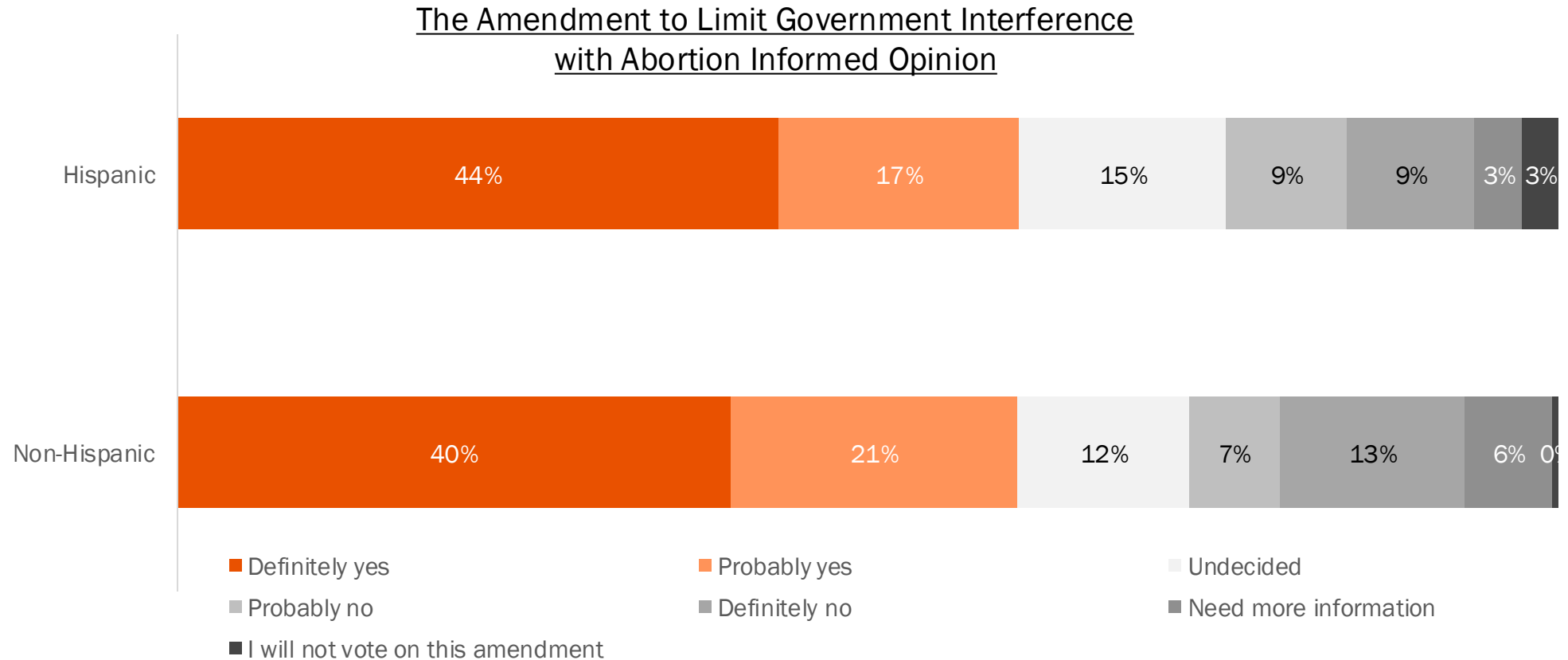


# The Amendment to Limit Government Interference with Abortion Informed Opinion

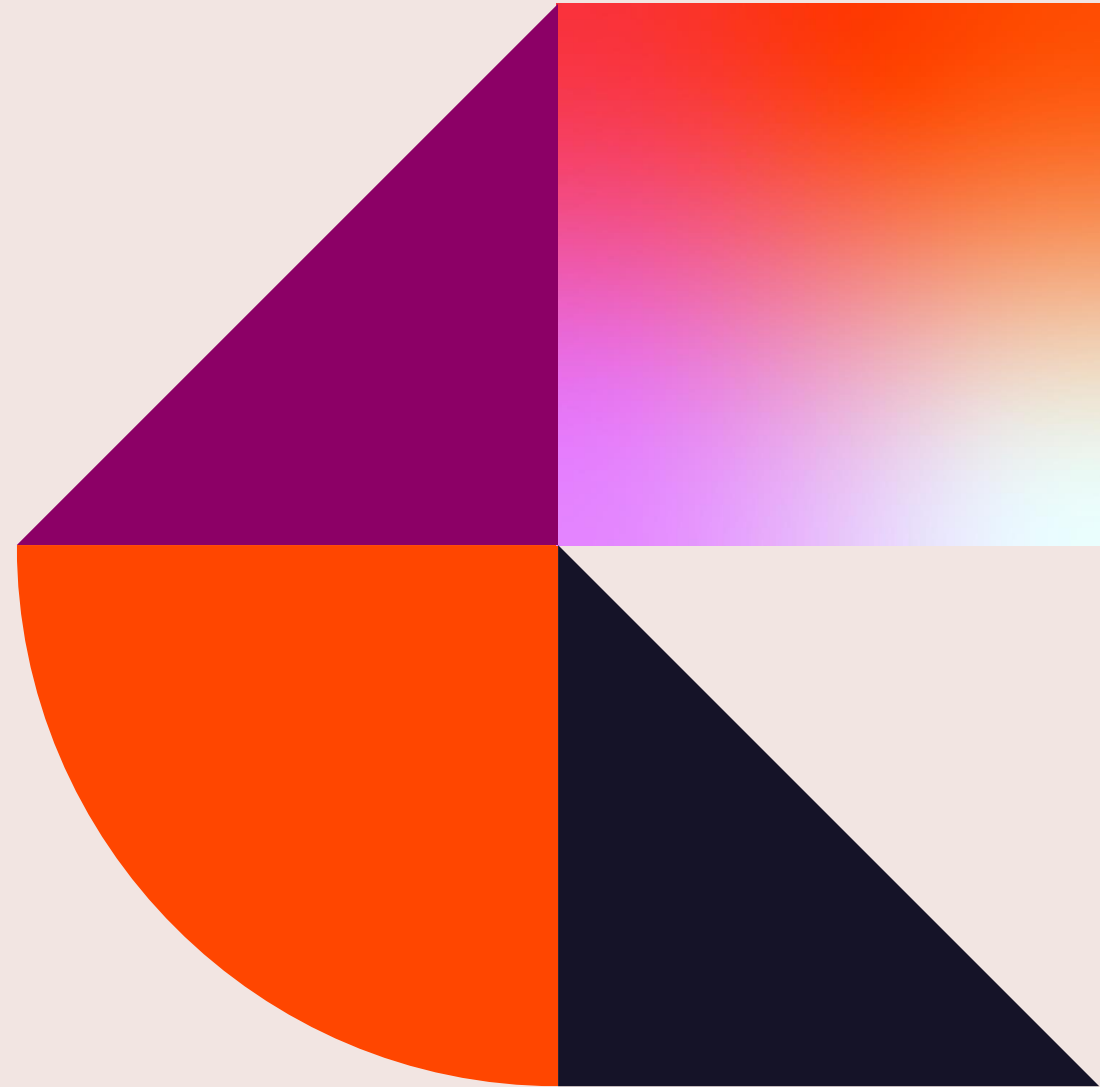

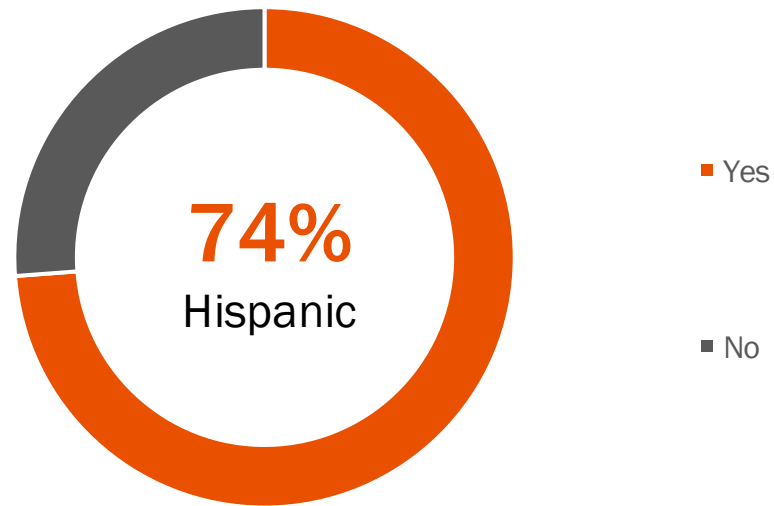

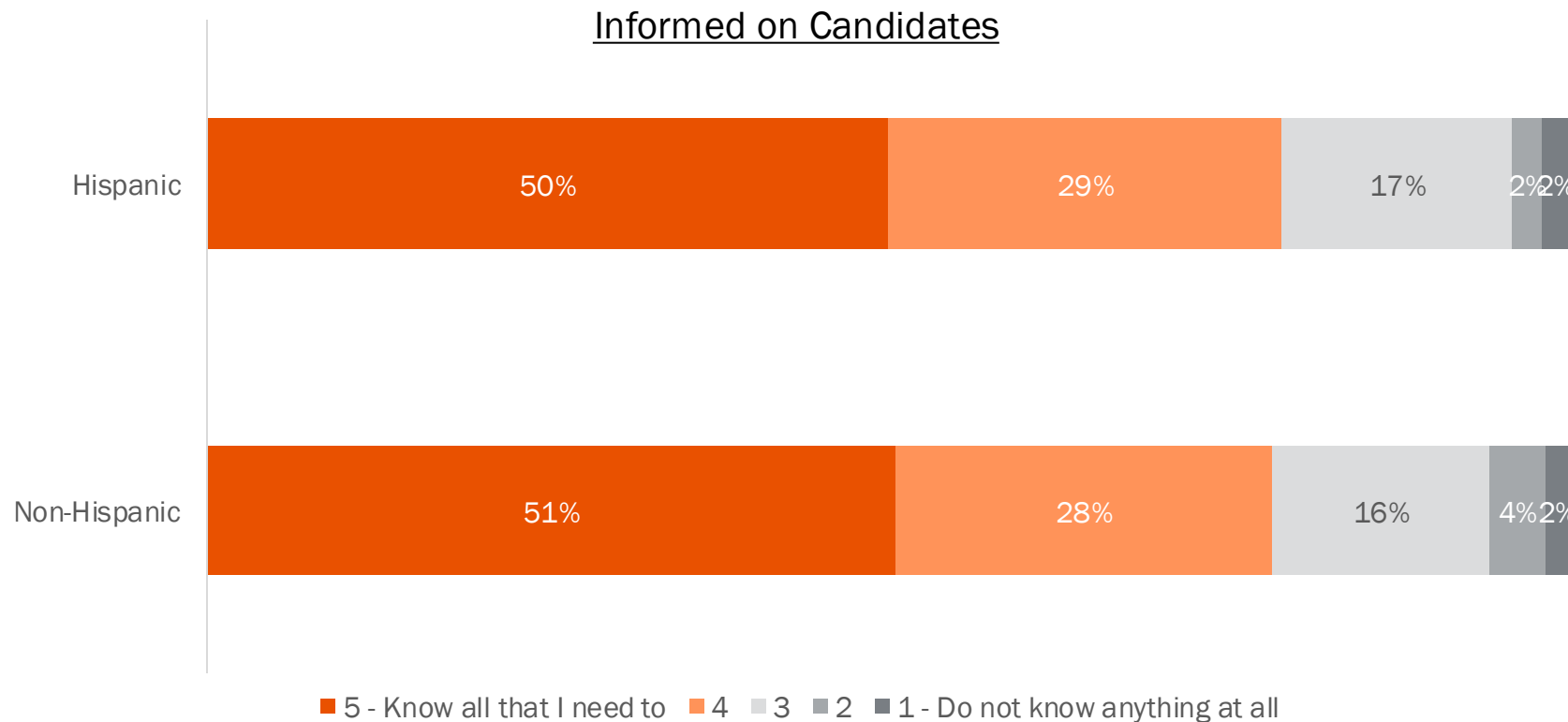

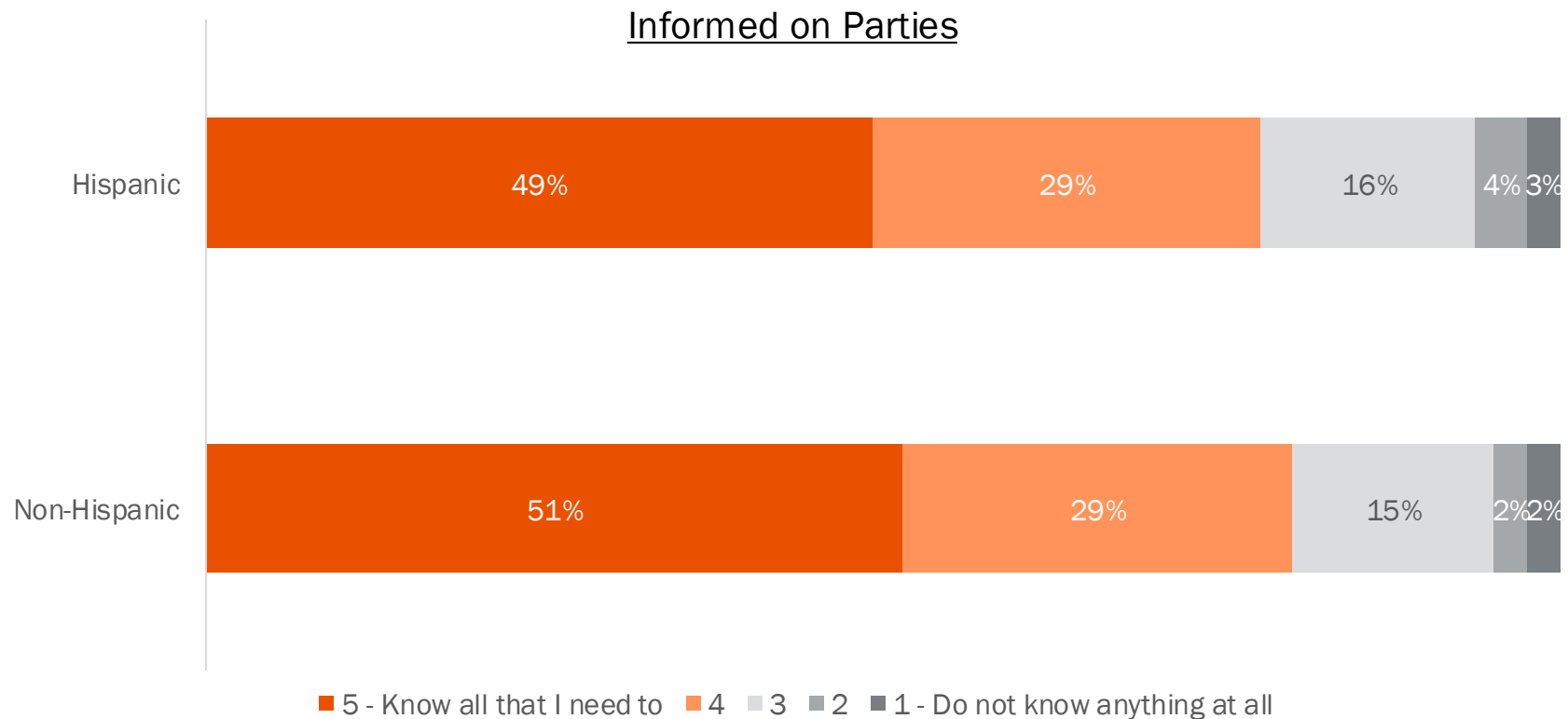
# 50% of Hispanics Need More Information About the Candidates & Their Positions on the Issues

Do you think that you know enough now about the candidates and their positions on the issues most important to you to confidently make a voting decision?



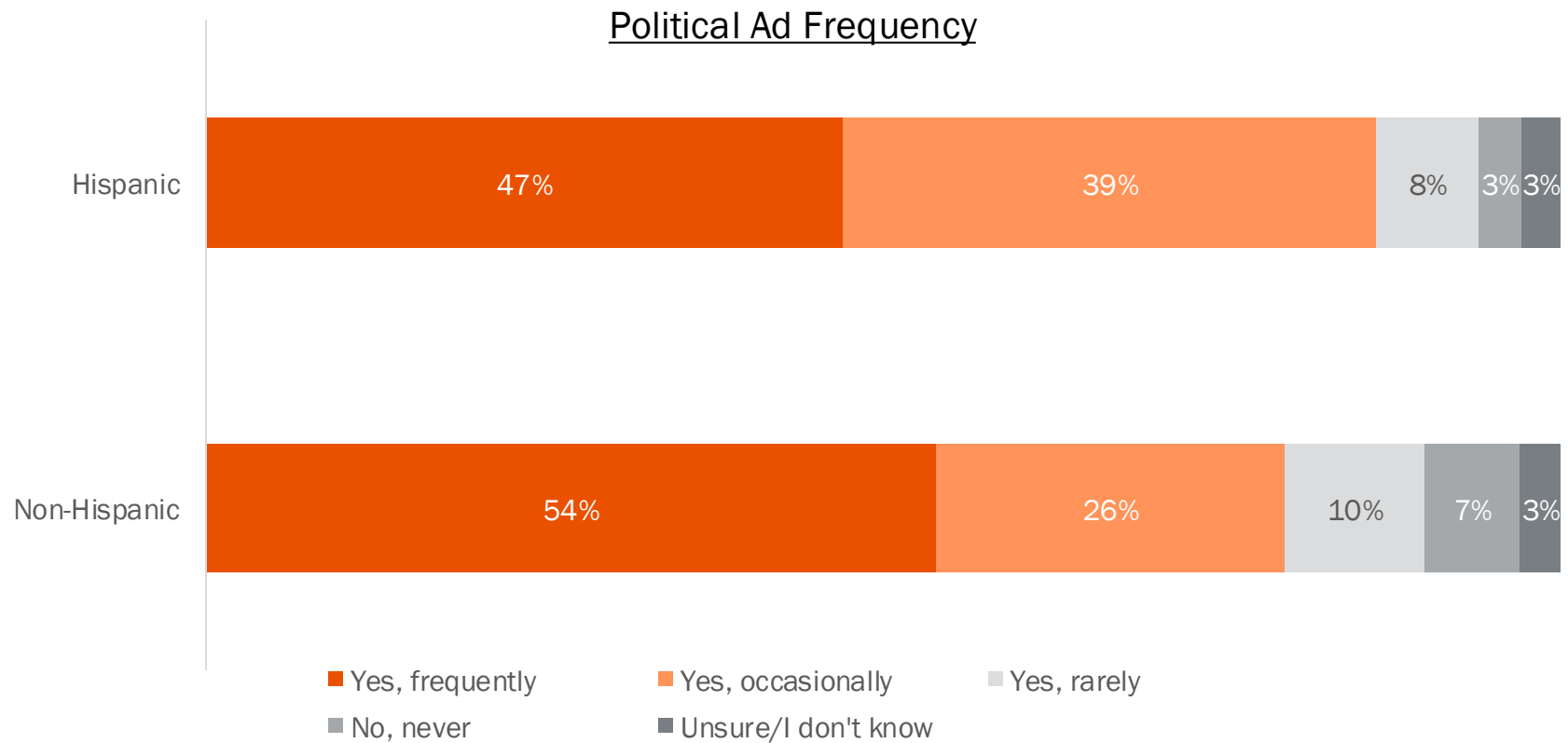
# 51% of Hispanics Don't Have All the Party Information They Need to Make Voting Decision

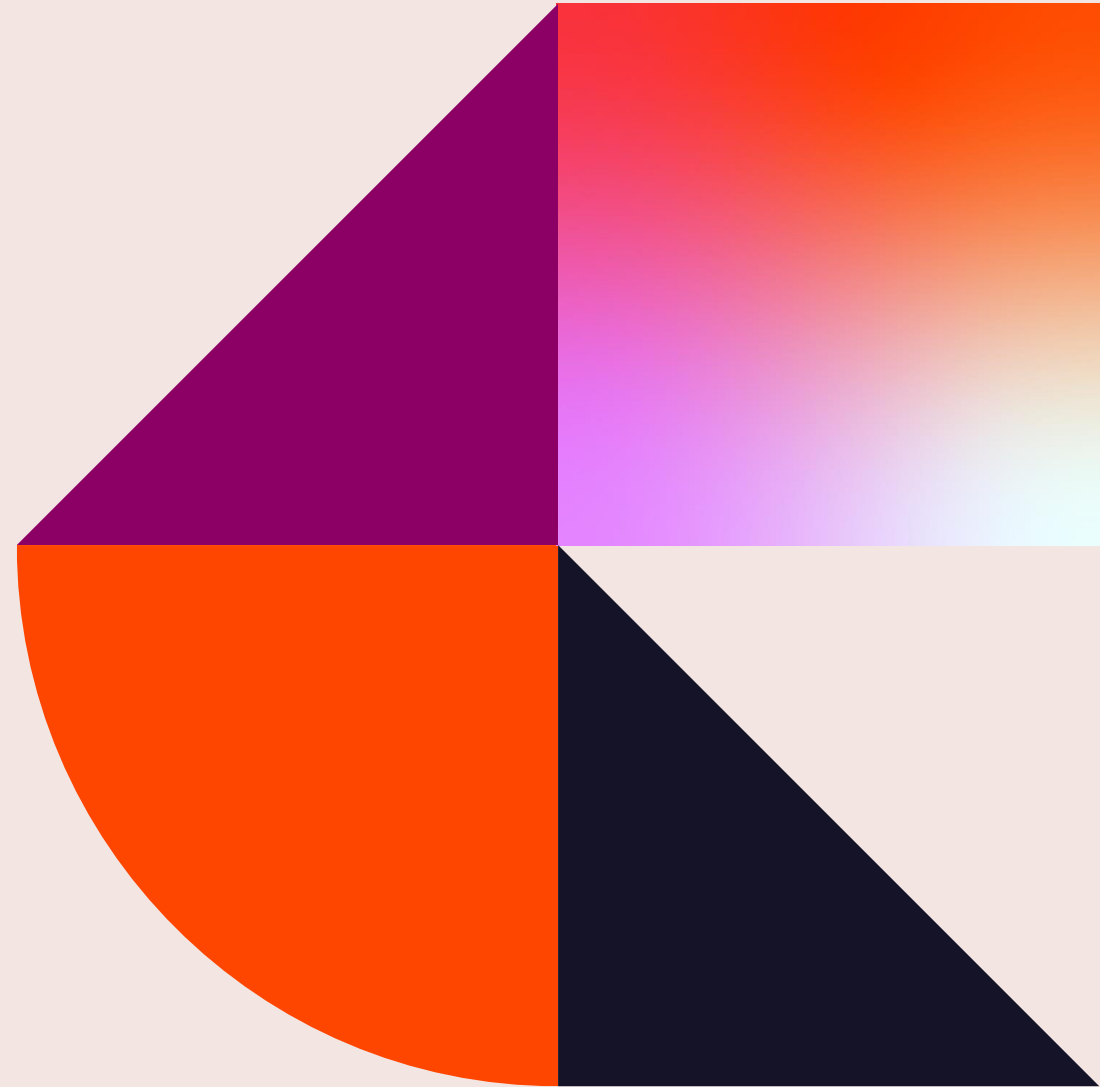

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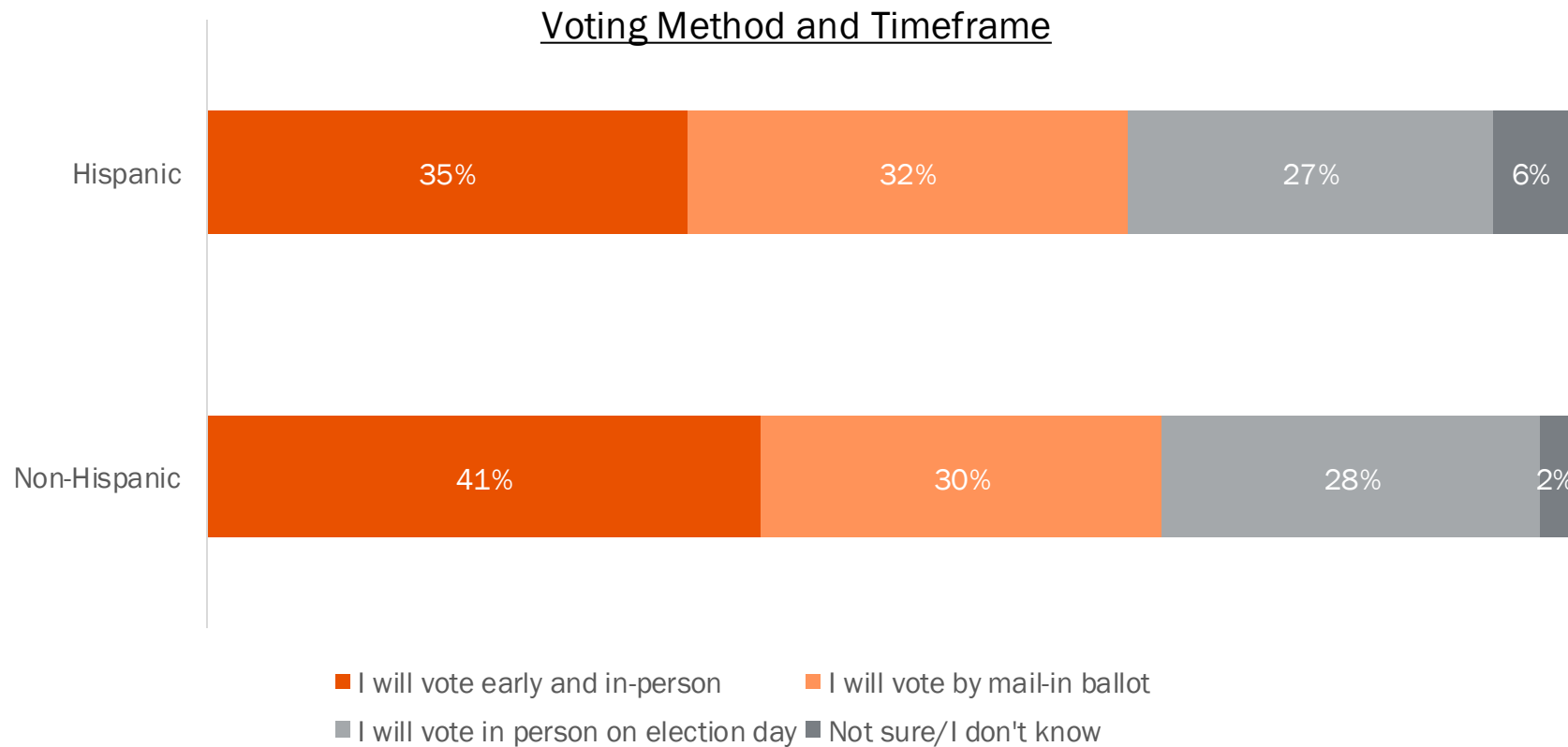

- HISPANICS MORE LIKELY THAN NON-HISPANICS TO VOTE BY MAIL

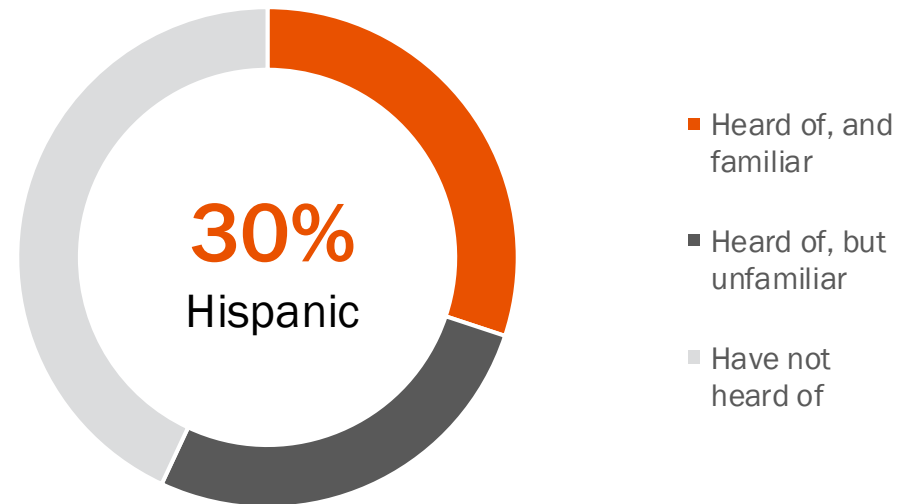
How do you plan to vote in the General election?

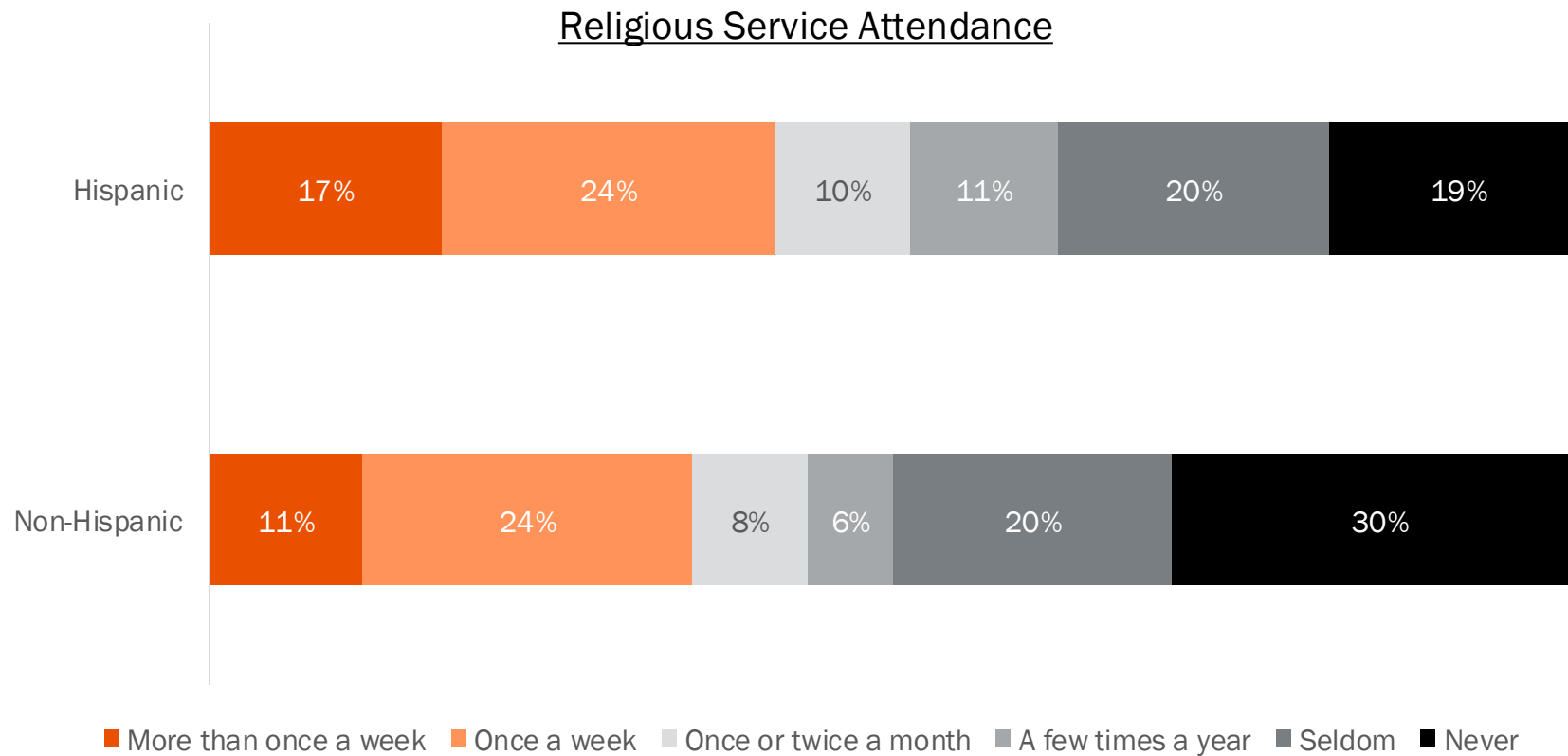
