


Objectives

- Measure awareness of propositions on the General Election Ballot
- Assess the way respondents intend to vote both before and after reading a description of each proposition
- Understand the reasons behind voters' intent
- Compare and contrast Hispanic and Non-Hispanic voters


Methodology

• Online survey of 1,395 likely voters ages 18+



- In field 9/11/2024 9/13/2024
- Weighted to the registered voter universe by age, gender, education, and political party affiliation. Results from full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 3.8% for Hispanics and 3.8% for Non-Hispanics.








Proposition 4 – Blind Intent

If the election were held today, would you vote yes or no on this proposition?






Proposition 4 – Informed Intent

Reasons For Proposition 4

Which of the following most closely align with your reasons for voting in favor? Select all that apply.	Hispanic	Non-Hispanic
We must do everything that we can to mitigate climate risks	71%	75%
All/Most of this spending goes to important priorities in California	51%	61%



Reasons Against Proposition 4

Which of the following most closely align with your reasons for voting against? Select all that apply.	Hispanic	Non-Hispanic
The state has serious fiscal problems and I am concerned the bonds will make them worse	46%	51%
Instead of adding more spending, money should be repurposed from elsewhere in the state budget. It seems that there is a lot of "fat" in the state's budgets	43%	48%
There is ample money already being spent on the environment and climate	38%	37%
It seems like another "pork barrel" spending measure that will have little real impact	38%	53%
These are nice priorities, but the state can't afford this spending	27%	47%
Local governments and utilities should pay for this	18%	27%





Which of the following most closely align with your reasons for voting in favor? Select all that apply.	Hispanic	Non-Hispanic
Affordable housing is a serious issue in California and this seems like a good way to help alleviate the problem	69%	80%
We must do everything that we can to create more affordable housing units in California	60%	65%
We should make it easier for local governments to get approval to finance affordable housing projects	37%	43%

Reasons Against Proposition 5

Which of the following most closely align with your reasons for voting against? Select all that apply.	Hispanic	Non-Hispanic
This appears to make it easy to raise property taxes	62%	53%
Californians can't afford higher taxes	59%	73%
There is ample money already being spent on lower-income housing	42%	26%
Governments in California have spent a lot on affordable housing and not made things better, and this seems like more of the same	35%	56%
We should not make it easier for governments to spend money	31%	40%






Proposition 6 – Blind Intent






Proposition 6 – Informed Intent

Reasons For Proposition 6

Which of the following most closely align with your reasons for voting in favor? Select all that apply.	Hispanic	Non-Hispanic
Voluntary work programs can enhance human dignity and rehabilitation, while involuntary work does the opposite	58%	68%
Involuntary servitude is the same as slavery	40%	45%
Involuntary servitude is wrong	33%	43%
Being in jail is sufficient punishment for crimes	33%	33%
Forcing people to work seems to be an unfair, cruel, and unreasonable punishment	33%	38%

Reasons Against Proposition 6

Which of the following most closely align with your reasons for voting against? Select all that apply.	Hispanic	Non-Hispanic
I don't see anything wrong with expecting people to work as part of their sentence or punishment	66%	72%
Prisoners should be expected to work if they are able	59%	63%
Having to work does not seem to be an unfair expectation of prisoners	54%	66%
This will raise the costs to taxpayers of the prison system	36%	25%





Reasons For Proposition 32

Which of the following most closely align with your reasons for voting in favor? Select all that apply.	Hispanic	Non-Hispanic
Given the rise in the cost of living and inflation, it is necessary to raise minimum wages in California	67%	74%
Workers need to be paid a fair and reasonable wage	63%	63%
We just raised the minimum wage in the fast-food industry; workers in other industries also deserve a higher minimum wage	44%	52%
Companies will pay unfair, low wages if they can get away with it; this will help prevent that	44%	44%
These minimum wages are something that businesses can afford	39%	36%

Reasons Against Proposition 32

Which of the following most closely align with your reasons for voting against? Select all that apply.	Hispanic	Non-Hispanic
We have just seen the negative impacts on the fast-food industry from raising the minimum wage. I don't think that we should do that for the rest of the economy right now	65%	66%
The minimum wage is high enough already	41%	44%
It will likely raise the number of unemployed people in California	40%	46%
We are likely going into a soft economic time, maybe recession. Now is not the time to raise the minimum wage	38%	40%
Businesses in the lower-cost parts of the state will not be able to afford these wages	35%	52%
The market should set wages	25%	39%





Capping rent increases will make it easier for working people and families to afford to live in California	62%	62%
California needs much more affordable housing, and this seems like a good way to help	54%	61%
Capping rent increases will help reduce inflation	45%	43%
Giving local governments the ability to make laws will allow them to be better suited to the local community	31%	37%
Giving local governments the ability to make laws will most like make them more effective and successful	29%	33%

Reasons Against Proposition 33

Which of the following most closely align with your reasons for voting against? Select all that apply.	Hispanic	Non-Hispanic
It is unfair to the landlords, especially small ones	50%	46%
Rent control will end up decreasing, rather than increasing, the supply of rental units	37%	43%
Rent control reduces the incentives to build new affordable housing units and to maintain them	37%	41%
If it lowers property tax revenue, then governments will have to raise other taxes to pay for it	34%	38%
Rent control programs have generally not worked well where they have been tried	31%	41%





Reasons For Proposition 34

Which of the following most closely align with your reasons for voting in favor? Select all that apply.	Hispanic	Non-Hispanic
Prescription drug prices are high, and this seems like a good way to control them	56%	60%
Companies shouldn't be making excess profits on selling prescription medicines	54%	57%
Healthcare providers need to be more tightly regulated and supervised to ensure that their prices are not excessive	52%	62%
Giving Medi-Cal permanent authority to negotiate drug prices is a good idea	42 %	53%

Reasons Against Proposition 34

Which of the following most closely align with your reasons for voting against? Select all that apply.	Hispanic	Non-Hispanic
This seems very complicated and will drive up compliance costs and, therefore, healthcare costs	49%	49%
This would likely drive up the costs for other health care to cover any losses from this rule	46%	35%
The growing involvement of governments and their regulators in healthcare has only been making healthcare more expensive	36%	41%
This will make it less likely for private healthcare companies to want to do business in California	32%	33%
We don't need more rules regarding, or government involvement in, healthcare	26%	42%





Reasons For Proposition 35

Which of the following most closely align with your reasons for voting in favor? Select all that apply.	Hispanic	Non-Hispanic
Medi-Cal needs to be properly funded and this seems like a good way to do it	57%	67%
We need to do what is necessary to fund Medi-Cal	51%	60%
This just makes permanent what is already in place	39%	38%
If this tax goes away, it will create a deficit at Medi-Cal that will have to be covered through another potentially more problematic tax	30%	38%



Reasons Against Proposition 35

Which of the following most closely align with your reasons for voting against? Select all that apply.	Hispanic	Non-Hispanic
California needs to be finding ways to reduce spending and taxes, not raising them	57%	65%
Californians can't afford this	53%	49%
It makes managed care plans more expensive	51%	35%
We need to make Medi-Cal more efficient before we raise taxes to pay for more spending	45%	48%
It places an unfair burden on people with managed care plans	35%	36%





This will help address the growing crime problem in California	62%	70%
This will make our streets safer	51%	55%
This will help improve the quality of life in California	43%	48%
Will encourage addicts to seek treatment	38%	38%
This is essential to making California "livable" again	36%	49%
This will reduce the number of businesses that are closing stores in California	35%	37%
This will especially help small businesses	29%	36%

Reasons Against Proposition 36

Which of the following most closely align with your reasons for voting against? Select all that apply.	Hispanic	Non-Hispanic
It is unfair to convict and imprison as felons those who commit these minor types of crimes	49%	48%
It will reduce funds for worthy causes such as mental health and schools	43%	53%
This will overburden our courts and prison system	39%	56%
This will dramatically increase the costs of our judicial system	36%	51%
The punishment will not fit the crime	33%	48%
It will disproportionately impact minorities	27%	45%
